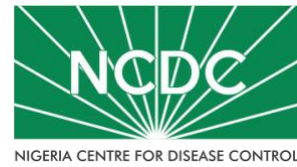

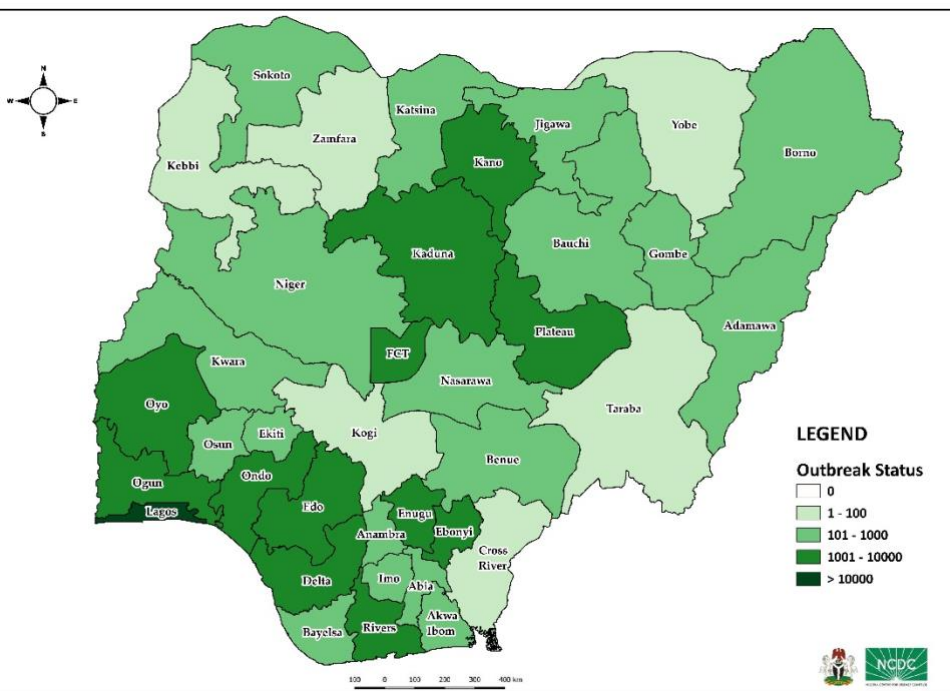
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 7th SEPTEMBER 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- One hundred (**155**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from **16** states – Lagos (42), Plateau (25), Rivers (16), Ebonyi (10), FCT(9), Abia (9), Ogun (9), Osun (7), Katsina (6), Kaduna (6), Ekiti (4), Taraba (4), Edo (3), Anambra (2), Akwa Ibom (2), Kano (1)
- Two hundred and eighteen (**218**) discharges have been reported in the last 24 hours in **13** states – Plateau (95), Edo (38), Rivers (25), Ogun (15), FCT (12), Ebonyi (12), Ekiti (5), Kaduna (4), Akwa Ibom (4), Bayelsa (3), Oyo (2), Osun (2) and Imo (1).
- Four (**4**) deaths were reported in the last 24 hours in **four** states – Rivers (1), Ebonyi (1), Oyo (1) and Sokoto (1).
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK37)

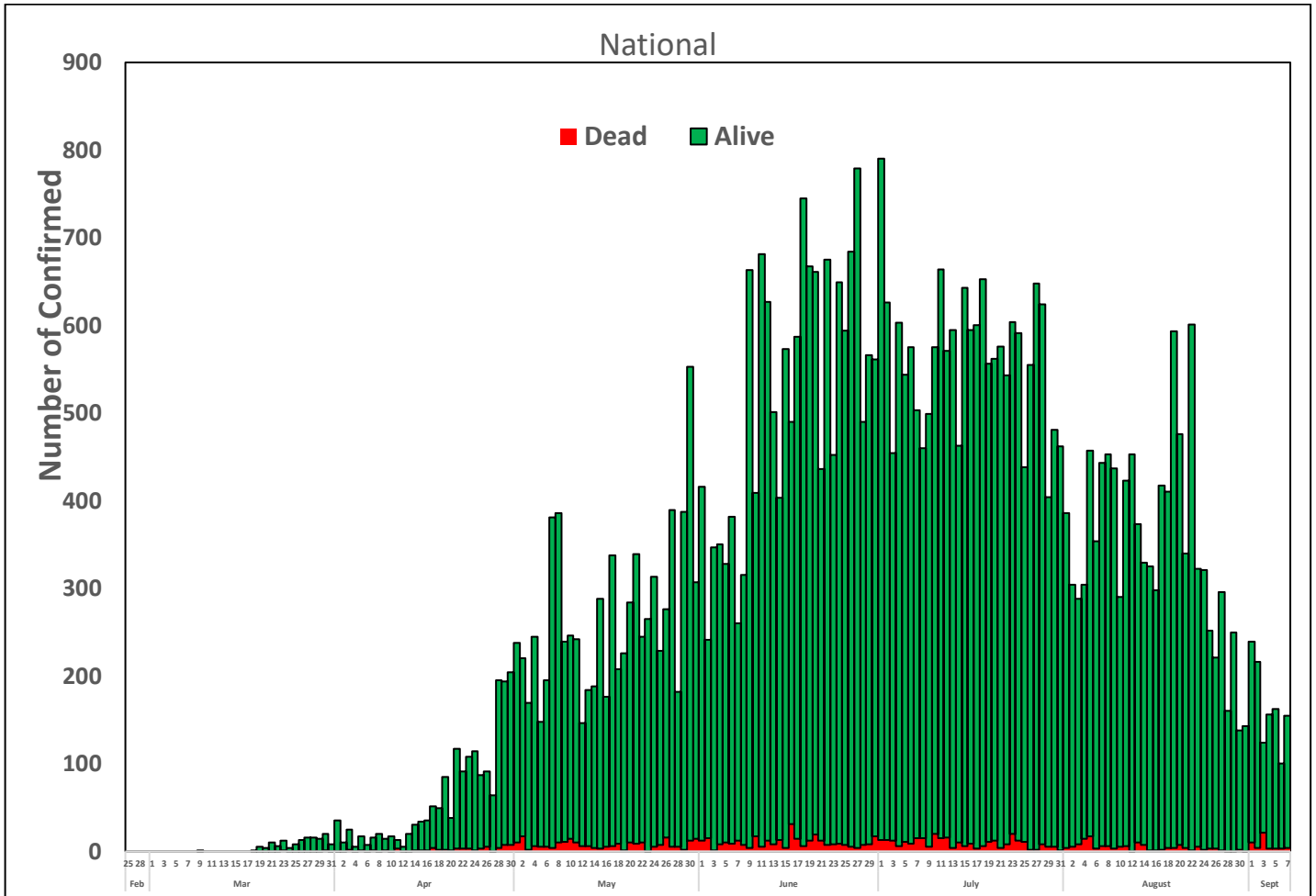
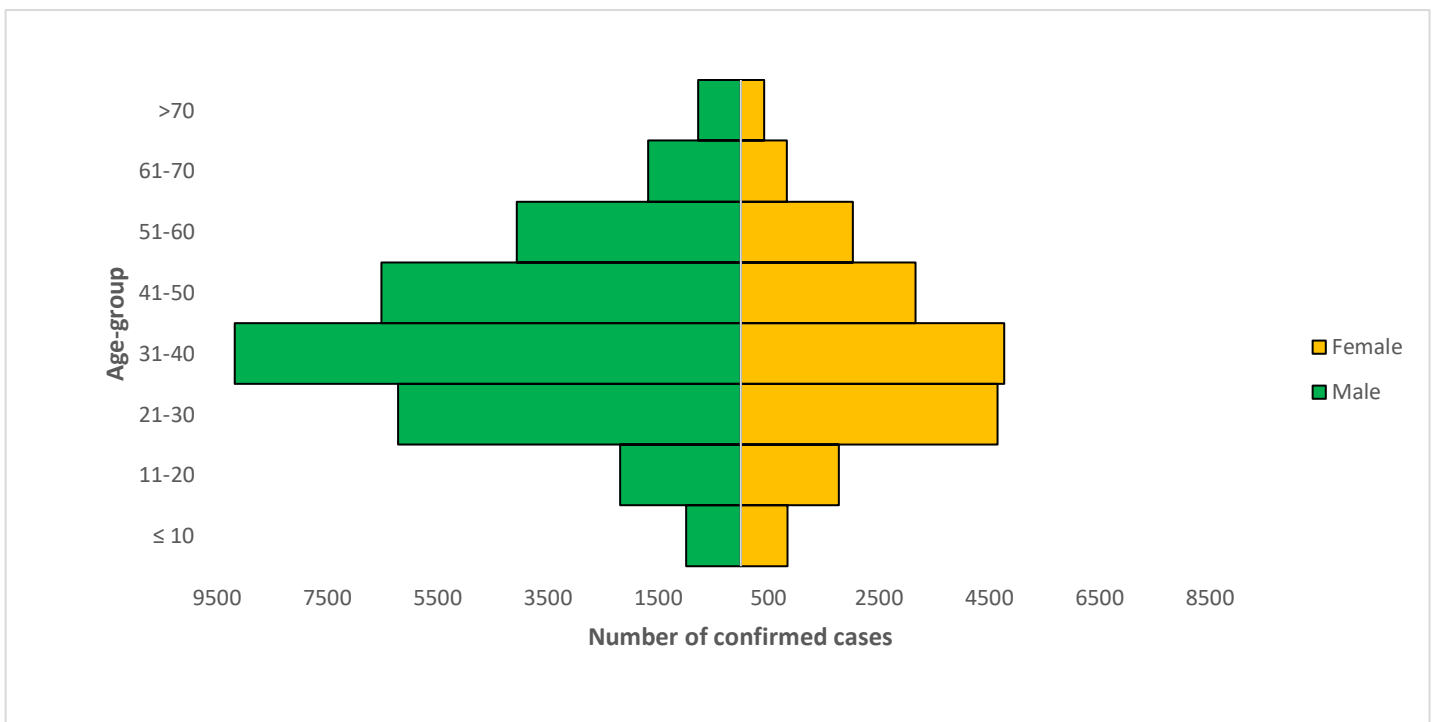


Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK37)

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Engaged with the management of Lagoon Hospital, Lagos and conducted training of 11 non-clinical staff on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC)**
- **Commenced training on the use of Abbott in Plasveric laboratory, Jos, Plateau State**
- **Conducted media appearances and chats to discuss the COVID-19 outbreak response and update the general public on preventive measure to ensure safety**
- Currently engaging with states in the South West to commence roll out of digitisation of negative laboratory results
- Completed re-stocking of reagents and commodities for six (6) laboratories in Anambra, Benue, Cross River, Plateau, Taraba and Yobe States

- Provided GeneXpert cartridges for commencement of community case finding using mobile truck in Imo State
- Developed IPC guidelines on school re-opening
- Developed and disseminated bi-weekly messaging priorities and key messages to stakeholders and states
