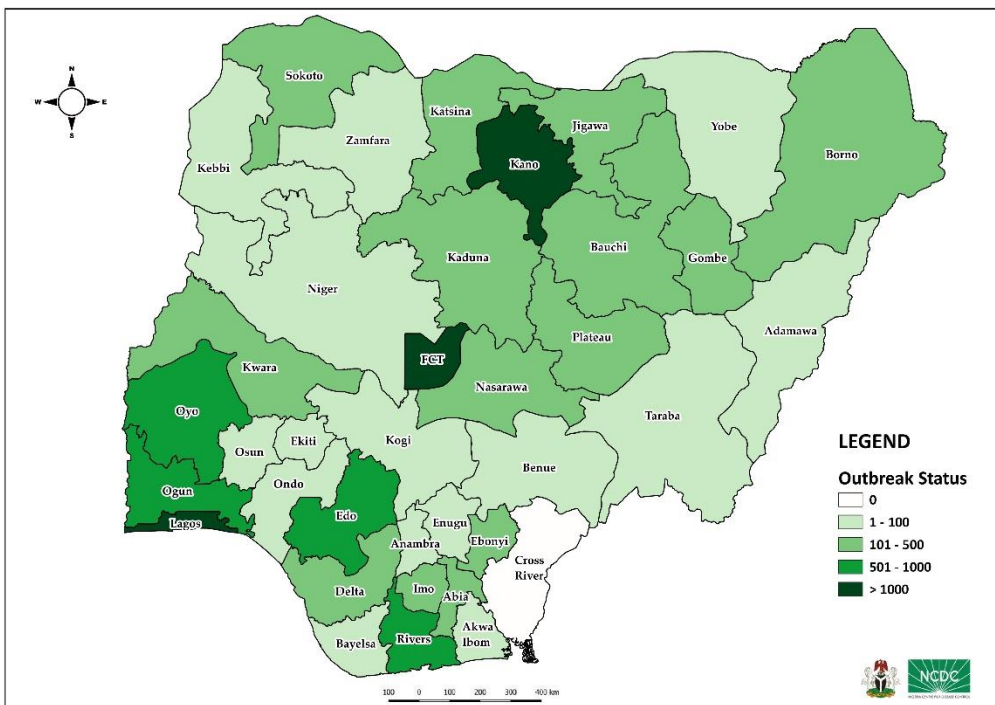
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 16<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2020

### HIGHLIGHTS

- Four hundred and ninety (**490**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from sixteen (**16**) states – Lagos (142), FCT (60), Bayelsa (54), Rivers (39), Delta (37), Oyo (30), Kaduna (26), Imo (23), Enugu (19), Kwara (17), Gombe (11), Ondo (10), Bauchi (8), Ogun (7), Borno (6) and Benue (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still **36** (35 states + FCT).
- Two hundred and seventy-four (**274**) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in fourteen (**14**) states – Lagos (165), Kano (37), Rivers (22), Katsina (14), Anambra (7), Borno (6), FCT (6), Kwara (5), Adamawa (3), Bauchi (3), Ondo (3), Enugu (1), Imo (1) and Kaduna (1).
- Thirty-one (**31**) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five (**5**) states – Lagos (25), FCT (2), Rivers (2), Borno (1) and Oyo (1).

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK25)

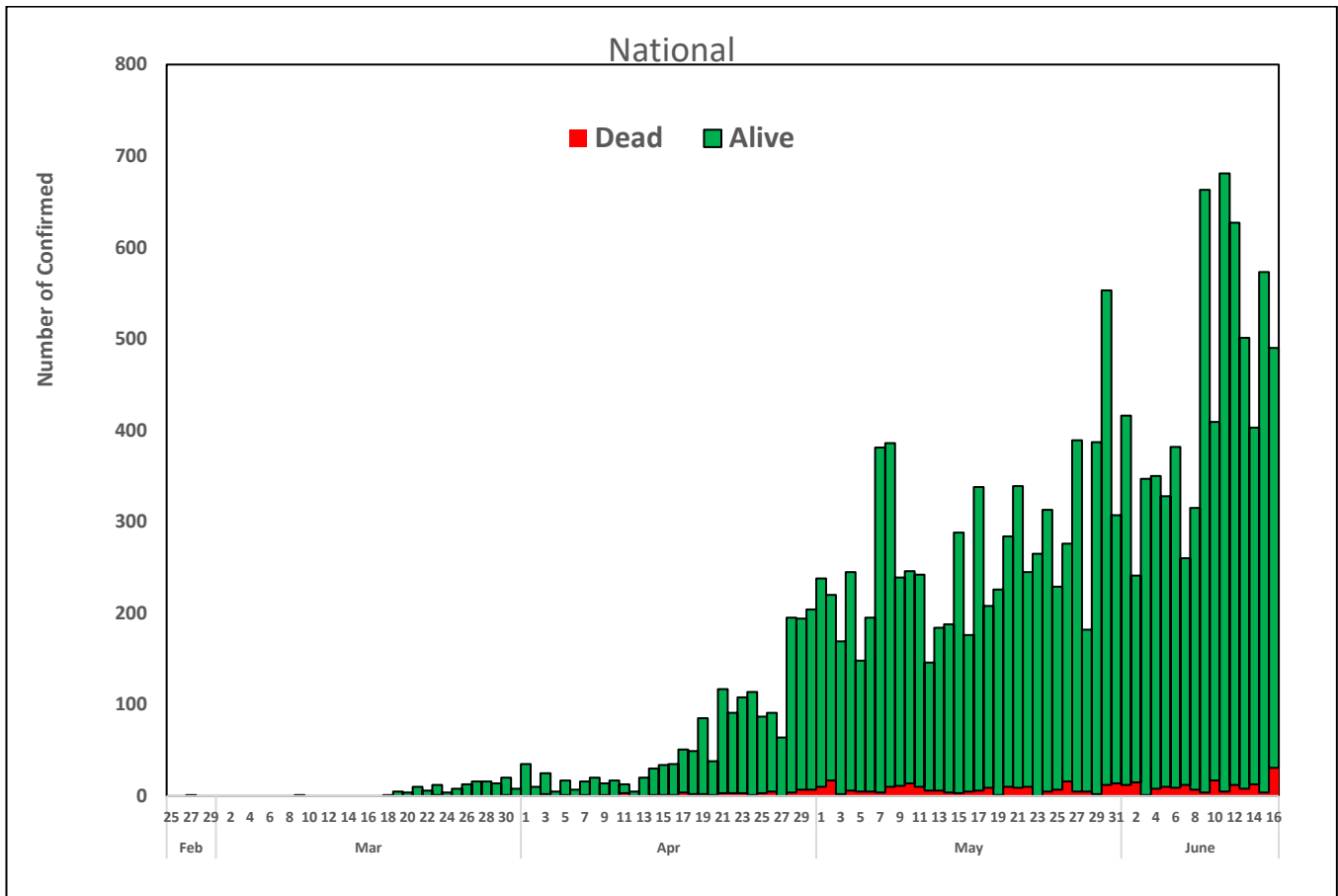
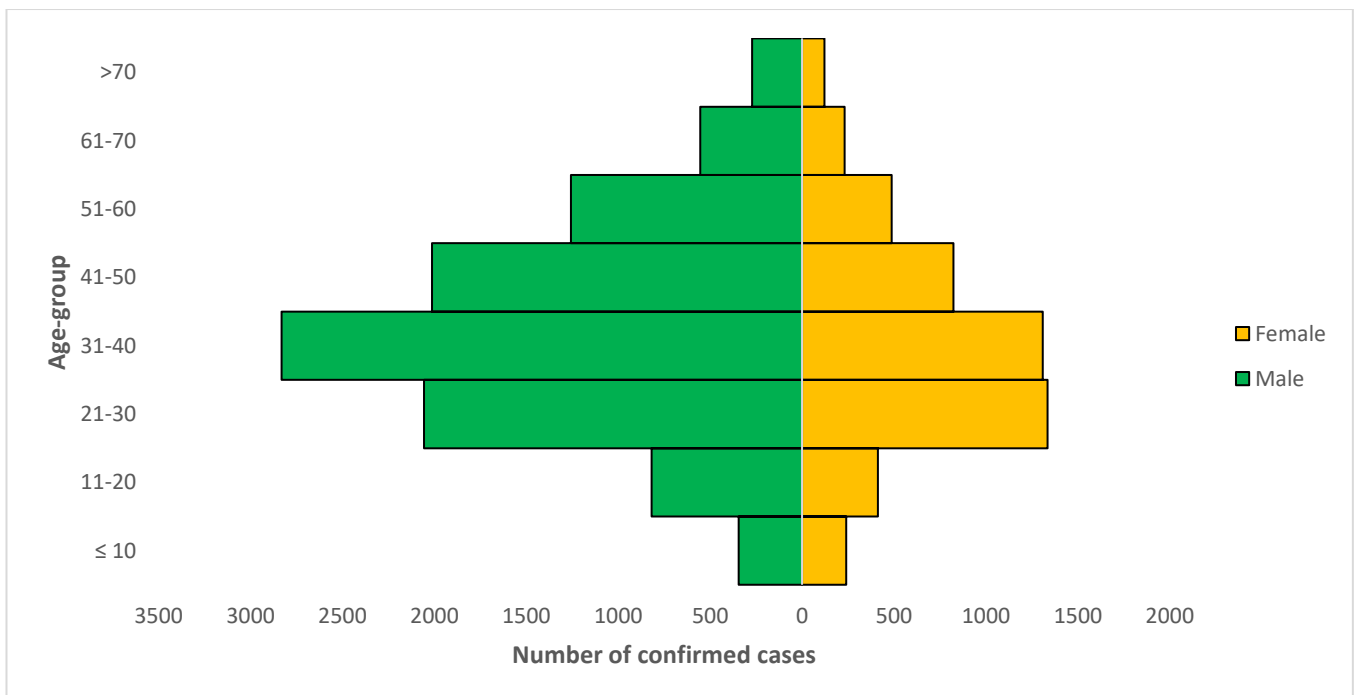


Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK25)



## PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- Guidelines have been issued for the [safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19](#)

- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the [integration of private labs](#).

## RESPONSE

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Continued engagement with states on contact tracing approach and case finding**
- **Data and SORMAS teams held finalisation meeting on dashboards automation for state and national level analysis**
- **Ongoing monitoring of adherence to National Interim Case Management guidelines by clinicians across treatment centres**
- **Conducted training on IPC for stakeholders across Local Government Areas (LGAs) of Ebonyi**
- **Onsite sample collection training in Enugu**
- **Conducted training of health reporters on factual reporting on COVID-19 in Kano**
- **Completed additional commodities distribution to all States and all labs within the laboratory network**
- **Ongoing analysis of utilisation records received from states for enhanced forecasting and needs assessment**
- **Deployment of response teams to support Port Health Services (PHS) to capture passenger information electronically into SORMAS in Lagos and Abuja airports**
- **Conducted the first in series of planned IPC training for tertiary and private hospitals supported by partners in Kebbi State**
- **Guideline for worship places launched and circulated to religious leaders and the public**
