HIGHLIGHTS

- The multi-agency cholera emergency operations centre (EOC) at NCDC continues to coordinate the response.
- There is a general decline in the number of cases reported. However, cases are still being reported from seven States; Adamawa, Bauchi, Kaduna, Katsina, Niger, Kano and Zamfara.
- No cases reported in the following states in the last two weeks: Gombe, FCT, Jigawa, Kogi, Yobe, Borno, Anambra and Nasarawa.


EPI-Summary

- In week 29 (16-22 July); 377 new suspected cases were reported from seven states- Adamawa (19), Bauchi (10), Kaduna (32), Kano (1), Katsina (81), Niger (6) and Zamfara (228) including nine deaths in four States Bauchi (1), Kaduna (4), Katsina (1), Zamfara (3).
- As at 24th July 2018, a total of 17,897 suspected cases including 223 deaths (CFR: 1.25%) have been reported from 17 States (Adamawa, Anambra, Bauchi, Borno, Ebonyi, FCT, Gombe, Jigawa, Kaduna, Kano, Katsina, Kogi, Nasarawa, Niger, Plateau, Yobe and Zamfara) since the beginning of 2018.
- Increasing number of cases reported in Zamfara, Kaduna and Katsina states.
- 51.9 % of the cases are aged 1-14 years; 1-4years (27.1%) and 5-14years (24.8%)
- 49.8% male and 50.2% female affected

Nigeria: States/LGAs affected by Cholera, Wk01-29, 2018































RESPONSE ACTIVITIES

Coordination

- Response is being coordinated by NCDC through an EOC in collaboration with NPHCDA, Federal Ministry of Water Resources (FMWR), WHO, UNICEF, MSF, AFENET, UMB and US-CDC
- EOC meetings hold in most affected states to coordinate the outbreak response
- National cholera stakeholders' consensus meeting held to discuss cholera hotspot LGAs and review of preventive OCV campaign implementation schedule on Thursday 19th July, 2018

Surveillance

- Clinician sensitization for early detection and reporting conducted
- Active case search is ongoing in affected States













Cases are included in the line-list daily with intensified surveillance in high risk states

Case management

Cases are being treated at designated health facilities or Cholera Treatment Centres (CTCs) in the affected States supported by partners

WaSH

Hygiene promotion and community sensitization ongoing

Laboratory Surveillance

- Samples are being tested with Rapid Diagnostic Test kits (RDTs) in the field and confirmed by stool culture.
- Assessment and mapping of two labs per states ongoing in Plateau, Katsina, Kano and Kaduna states
- Total number of positive laboratory results: 288

Risk communications

- Radio jingles in English, Hausa and pidgin ongoing in affected states
- IEC materials distribution to 10 states and NPHCDA

Logistics and Vaccination

- First round of OCV campaign completed in Maiha, Mubi North and Mubi South LGAs of Adamawa State vaccinating 377,935 persons with an administrative coverage of 112%
- Second round scheduled for 11-15 August, 2018

CHALLENGES

- Delay in submission of line-list for national update by some states
- Inadequate number of trained health care workers for case management
- Low proportion of samples tested by culture
- Poor IPC practices in health facilities

NEXT STEPS

- Deploy national RRTs to states with increasing number of cases
- Conduct laboratory needs assessment for cholera diagnosis in all the cholera active states
- Deploy risk communications team to Zamfara states for care givers sensitization
