## **HIGHLIGHTS**

- In Week 43, the number of new confirmed cases increased to **1,501** from **1,162** reported in • week 42. These were reported in 29 states and FCT (Tables 1 & 2). This includes backlog of cases reported from Abia (4), Benue (49), Delta (508), Enugu (24), Imo (16), and Lagos (10) States and FCT (8).
- In Week 43, the number of discharged cases decreased to 866 from 5,236 in week 42. These • were reported in 20 states and FCT (Tables 1 & 3).
- There were 12 deaths reported in the last one week (Tables 1 & 4). •

- Cumulatively, since the outbreak began in Week 9, 2020 there have been 211,961 cases and • 2,894 deaths reported with a case fatality rate (CFR) of 1.4% (Tables 1 & 4).
- In Week 43, the number of in-bound international travellers tested was 4,631 of which 35 were • positive compared to 25 (out of 2,894 tested) in week 42.
- In Week 43, the number of out-bound international travellers tested was 5,694 of which 38 were positive compared to 65 (out of 4,541 tested) in week 42.
- Worldwide, there has been 246,951,274 confirmed COVID-19 cases with 5,004,855 deaths • resulting in a case fatality rate of 2.0%.




Figure 3: Daily epidemic curve of confirmed cases as reported per day as of 31<sup>st</sup> October 2021

### AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN




Figure 7: Chart with age and gender breakdown of cases and deaths (WK10, 2020 – WK43, 2021)

# **IN FOCUS: Ensuring Adherence to COVID-19 Protocol at Conferences and Events**

In line with managing the outbreak and preventing an upsurge of COVID-19 cases in Nigeria, several protocols and guidelines have been put in place. These guidelines contain comprehensive steps on the prevention, detection, and management of COVID-19 cases in Nigeria, especially as activities resume following further ease of the lockdown. This is to ensure safety for all including the elderly and those with underlying conditions who are at a higher risk of death due to COVID-19.

Recently, the 4th International Conference on the Safe Schools Declaration was held at the ECOWAS Secretariat, Abuja co-hosted by Nigeria through the Federal Ministries of Education and Foreign Affairs. This marks the first time Nigeria has hosted the conference, and the first time the conference has held since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), in collaboration with FCT Department of Public Health ensured adherence to COVID-19 safety protocol from the planning phase including the pre-event and the conference. In addition to assessing the venue, as part of activities to ensure strict compliance to the <u>COVID-19 Safety Guideline for Conferences and Events in Nigeria</u>, NCDC coordinated the registration, verification, and screening of local and international participants at the event. Participants included co-hosts from the African Union Commission; the Governments of Argentina, Norway, and Spain; as well as the Global Coalition to Protect Education from Attack (GCPEA).

The NCDC remains committed to supporting the Federal Government of Nigeria, including its Ministries, Departments and Agencies in the safe implementation of conference activities and other events as the COVID-19 pandemic is managed.

## RESPONSE

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 which is the highest emergency level in Nigeria. This is led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC) and through the deployment of **59** Rapid Response Teams (RRT) to states. Currently, response activities include:

- Continued engagement with states to ensure regular reporting and response continuity
- Continued roll out of antigen based rapid diagnostic test (Ag-RDT) kits in collaboration with partners
  Continued tracking and collation of data from states for strategic coordination
- Ongoing COVID-19 vaccine effectiveness study in collaboration with National Primary Health Care
- Development Agency (NPHCDA) and the World Health Organisation (WHO)
- Ongoing data collection on COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy study
- Continued collation of reports on COVID-19 clinical management study
- Ongoing study on knowledge and compliance of health care workers to infection prevention and control (IPC) measures in the control of COVID-19 infection
- Ongoing research on drivers of mortality prognostic factors and other health sector challenges associated with COVID-19 deaths in treatment centres in Abia, Delta, Edo, Kaduna, Kano, Lagos, Niger, Ogun, Oyo, Plateau, Rivers, & Yobe States and Federal Capital Territory (FCT)
- Pilot of approach to active case search and contact tracing in Kaduna State with plan to roll-out in other states across the country
- Continued follow up with states for daily reporting, contact tracing and key challenges
- Ongoing enhanced surveillance at points of entry
- Ongoing camp sensitization lectures and monitoring of compliance in NYSC camps

- Held discussions with Enugu State Honorable Commissioner of Health on waste
  management in State and functionality of Incinerators in Health facility
- Supported the Safe School Declaration Conference in collaboration with risk communication and FCT surveillance teams
- Ongoing COVID-19 training of health care workers under the Nigeria Armed Forces medical wing
- Ongoing investigation of cases of healthcare worker infection in collaboration with Federal Capital Territory Administration (FCTA) COVID-19 response team
- Ongoing Nigeria Capacity Development (NiCaDe) change agent training for Health facilities in FCT
- Ongoing process to establish State IPC programme
- Ongoing assessment of 30 health facilities in the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) and Nasarawa State for IPC implementation in collaboration with Institute of Human Virology Nigeria (IHVN)
- Ongoing nationwide workshop on the use of the upgraded Nigeria International Travel Portal (NITP)
- Ongoing validation of Abbott ID-NOW rapid molecular equipment and with data analysis at the final stage
- Supported the Presidential Steering Committee in study for reopening of Nigeria-UAE flight route through protocol development
- Supported Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) with RDT testing of members of staff at ECOWAS
- Ongoing sequencing of positive samples among travellers to Nigeria and positive cases detected in-country, at the National Reference Laboratory (NRL), Gaduwa
- Supported the 2021 National Tuberculosis Conference with IPC materials
- Supported Federal Medical Centre (FMC); Owo PCR and University of Uyo Teaching Hospital (UUTH) PCR Laboratories with laboratory consumables and personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Supported Niger & Edo States Ministry of Health (SMoH) and National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) Batch C Stream I Exercise with sample collection consumables and RDT kits for increase COVID-19 testing
- Ongoing quarterly commodity monitoring and stock verification exercise to reconcile data across states, check available stock balance and utilisation records
- Ongoing prepositioning of PPE and commodities at the sub-national level for labs, treatment centres, sample collection centres and other relevant facilities as preparedness for surge in cases
- Attended the 4th International Conference on Safe Schools Declaration in FCT, Abuja
- Integrated COVID-19 messages by leveraging on the cholera RRT sent to Oyo, Kebbi, Adamawa, Sokoto, Gombe and Yobe States
- Disseminated safety guidelines for conducting events and conferences in Nigeria
- Continued support to National Primary Health Care Development Agency (NPHCDA) in COVID-19 vaccination campaign
- Ongoing media appearances on radio and television
