DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 24th May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Three hundred and thirteen (**313**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in seventeen (**17**) states – Lagos (148), FCT (36), Rivers (27), Edo (19), Kano (13), Ogun (12), Ebonyi (11), Delta (8), Nasarawa (8), Oyo (7), Plateau (6), Kaduna (5), Kwara (4), Akwa Ibom (3), Bayelsa (3), Niger (2) and Anambra (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still **35** (34 states + FCT).
- Eighty-nine (**89**) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in eleven (**11**) states – Lagos (31), Kaduna (16), Gombe (13), Sokoto (10), Rivers (7), Ebonyi (4), Borno (3), Ogun (2), Delta (1), Edo (1) and FCT (1).
- Five (**5**) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five (**5**) states – Delta (1), Edo (1), Ogun (1), Rivers (1) and Sokoto (1).

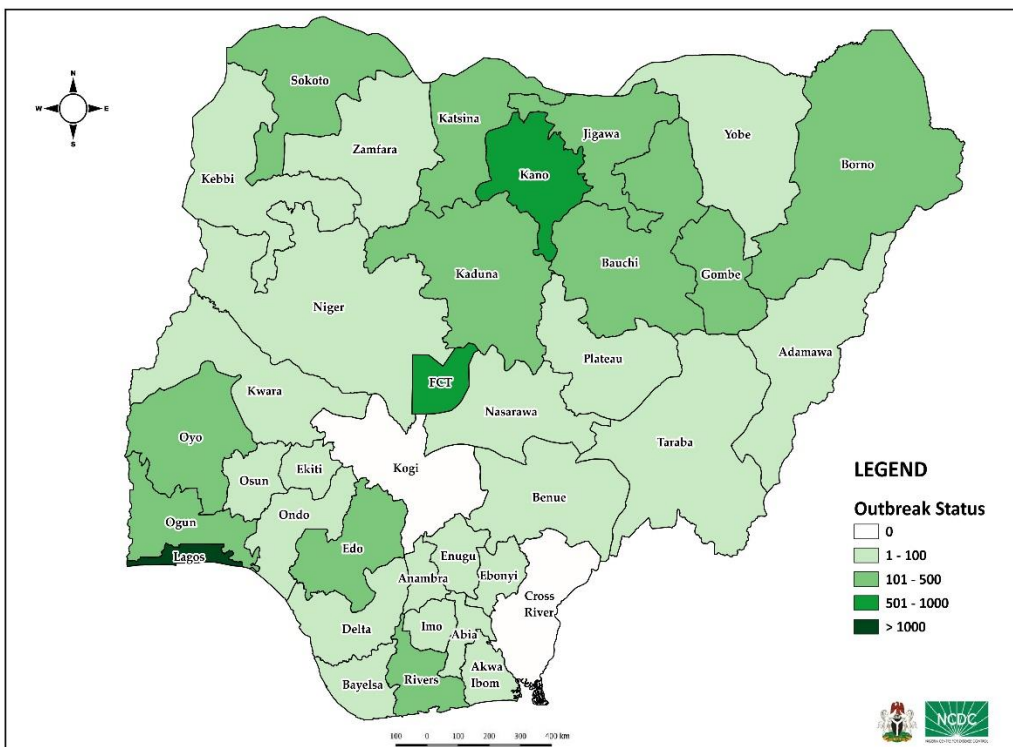

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)

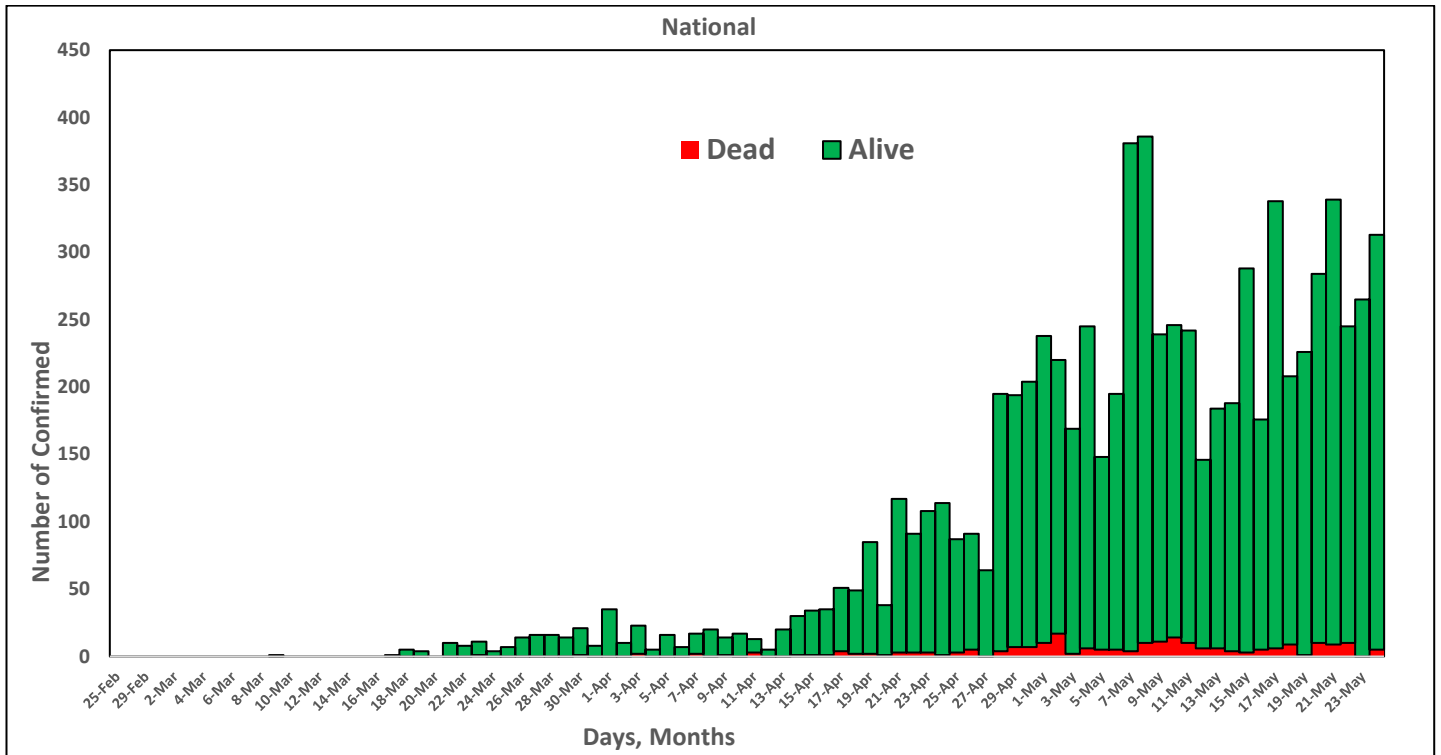
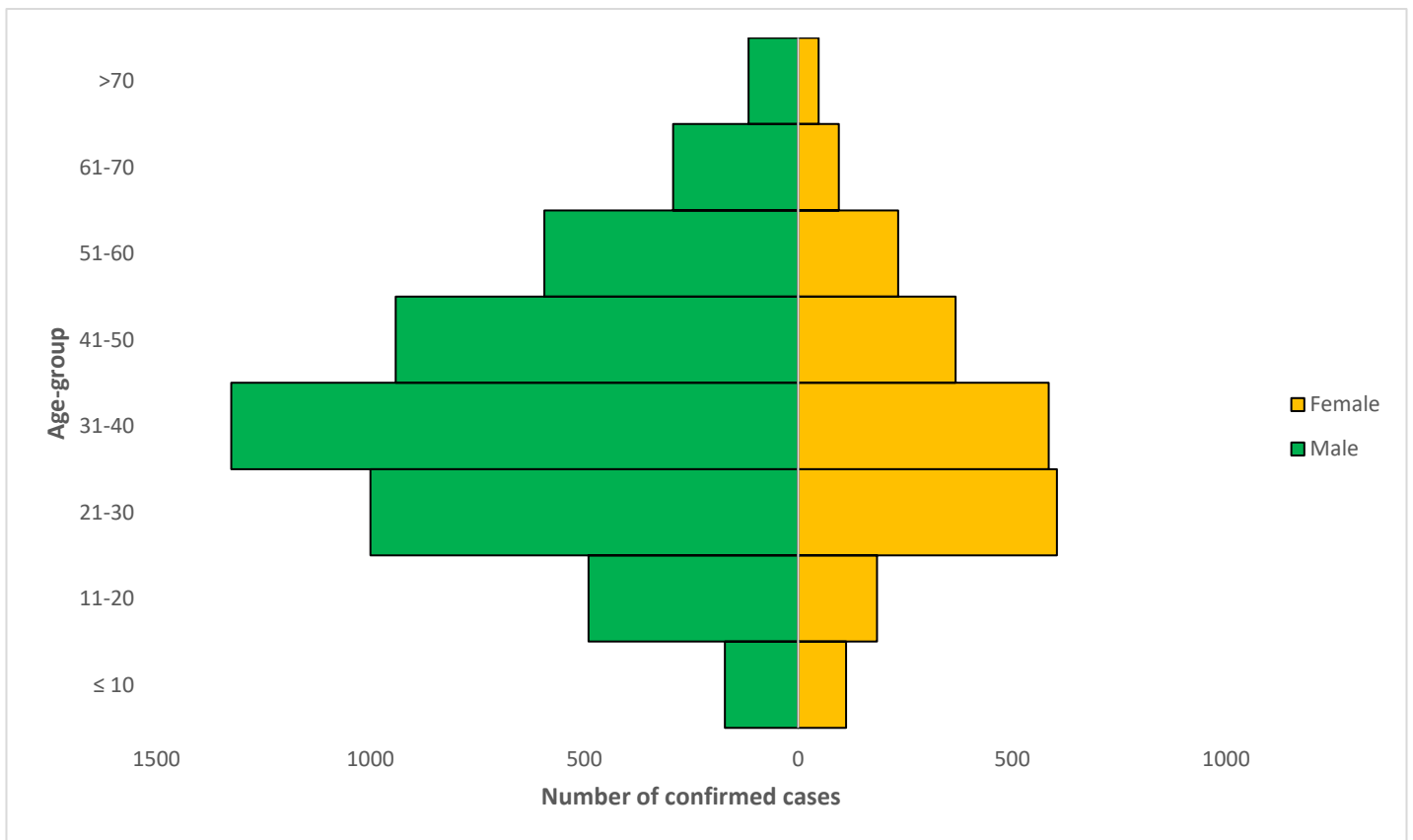


Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Trained Military Healthcare Workers (HCWs) in Benue**
- **Ongoing training of staff of new designated Isolation centres on IPC in Abuja**
- **Ongoing intensive data gathering on patient’s management in all states**
- **Deployment of COVID-19 response materials and commodities to Federal Medical Centre (FMC) Owerri**
- **Placement of 200 evacuees’ parks in Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport Abuja (NAIA)**
- Assessed the Armed Forces Isolation centre in Kano
- Engaged with traditional and religious leaders from 15 northern states
- Engaged with additional Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) to strategically expand the risk communications pillar stakeholders` base
- Completed commodities distribution to Isolation centres, Abuja, Port of Entries (POEs)
- Supplied Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) essentials to the returnees
- Commenced development of sector specific advisories on re-opening
- Conducted high level technical session on strategic outputs of Mid-Action Review (MAR) and identified priority activities for the next phase of the response
