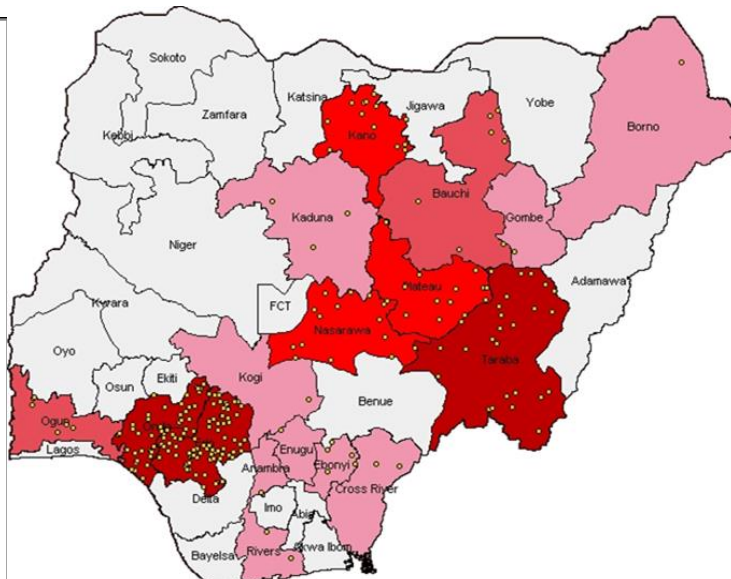
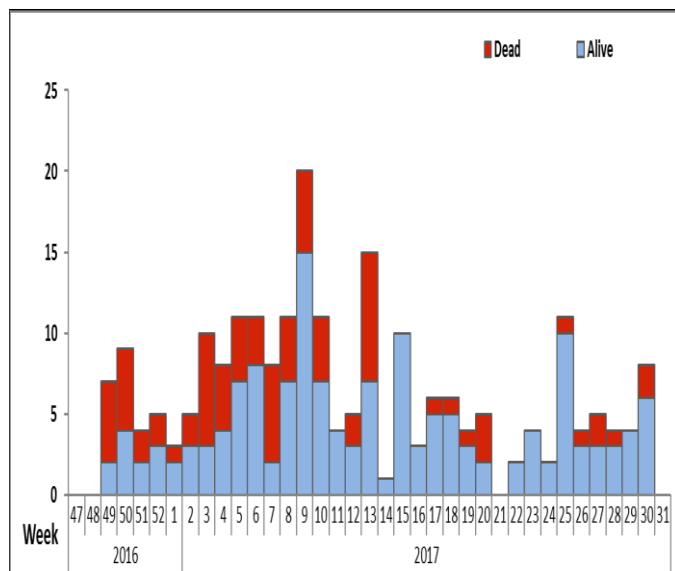




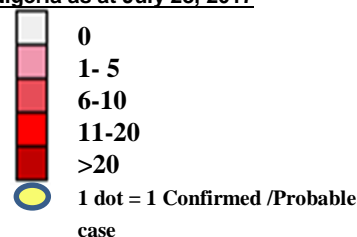
### Highlights

- In the current Lassa Fever outbreak, seventeen (17) States (Ogun, Bauchi, Plateau, Ebonyi, Ondo, Edo, Taraba, Nasarawa, Rivers, Kaduna, Gombe, Cross-River, Borno, Kano, Kogi, Enugu and Anambra) have reported at least one confirmed case – Figure 1
- As at week 30 (July 22-28, 2017), the outbreak is active in 4 states (Ondo, Edo Plateau and Bauchi). Bauchi state reported a new confirmed case this week. This brings the state back into the active outbreak category.
- Since the onset of LF outbreak in Dec. 2016 (Week 49), a total of 226 cases have been classified as: confirmed<sup>i</sup> (212) and probable<sup>ii</sup> (14), with 80 deaths (66 deaths in confirmed and 14 in probable recorded).
- Case Fatality Rate in confirmed and probable cases is 35.4% and 16.4% for all cases (including probable, confirmed and suspected).
- In the reporting Week 30 (July 22-28, 2017), 13 new suspected cases were reported in Plateau (5) Ogun (1) Ondo (5) and Bauchi (2) states. Eight (8) new confirmed cases were reported in Plateau (4), Ondo (3) and Bauchi (1) states. Two (2) deaths were reported in two confirmed cases from Bauchi (1) and Ondo (1) State.
- There are two (2) pending results from Bauchi state this week. Laboratory result of the suspected case from Ogun state came back negative
