DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 18th May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Two hundred and sixteen (216) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in 15 states - Lagos (74), Katsina (33), Oyo (19), Kano (17), Edo (13), Zamfara (10), Borno (8), Gombe (8), Ogun (8), Bauchi (7), Kwara (7), FCT (4), Enugu (3), Kaduna (3) and Rivers (2).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 35 (34 states + FCT).
- Fifty (50) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in nine (9) states - Bauchi (14), Zamfara (11), Borno (8), Sokoto (5), Enugu (4), Adamawa (2), Gombe (2), Kaduna (2), and Ogun (2)
- Nine (9) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in six (6) states -Bauchi (2), FCT (2), Lagos (2), Borno (1), Katsina (1) and Ogun (1)



Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular respond to the pandemic

- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found on our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management guide</u>.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the <u>management of dead bodies</u>.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> and <u>Mandatory institutional quideline</u> <u>for returnees to Nigeria</u> to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases</u>.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- High level engagement with Hospital Services and Secondary Health facilities to improve patients` management data quality
- Trained 3rd batch Health Care Workers (HCWs) in Kano state
- Assessment of Plateau state COVID-19 treatment centre
- Total number of activated labs now 26
- Assessment of Federal Medical Centre, Yenagoa Isolation Centre and supervisory visit to Mercy land Isolation Centre Osogbo
- Provision of hand wash stations, water and other WASH facilities in Local Government Areas (LGAs) and the Hajj Camp, Borno in collaboration with partners
- Develop sub-national risk-based decision-making matrix for risk level assessments at states and LGAs
- Trained First Aid workers for all religious groups in Gombe state
- Support provided for screening of Almaijirai coming into Jigawa state
