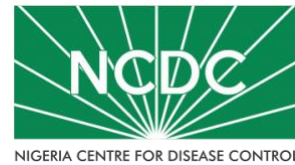

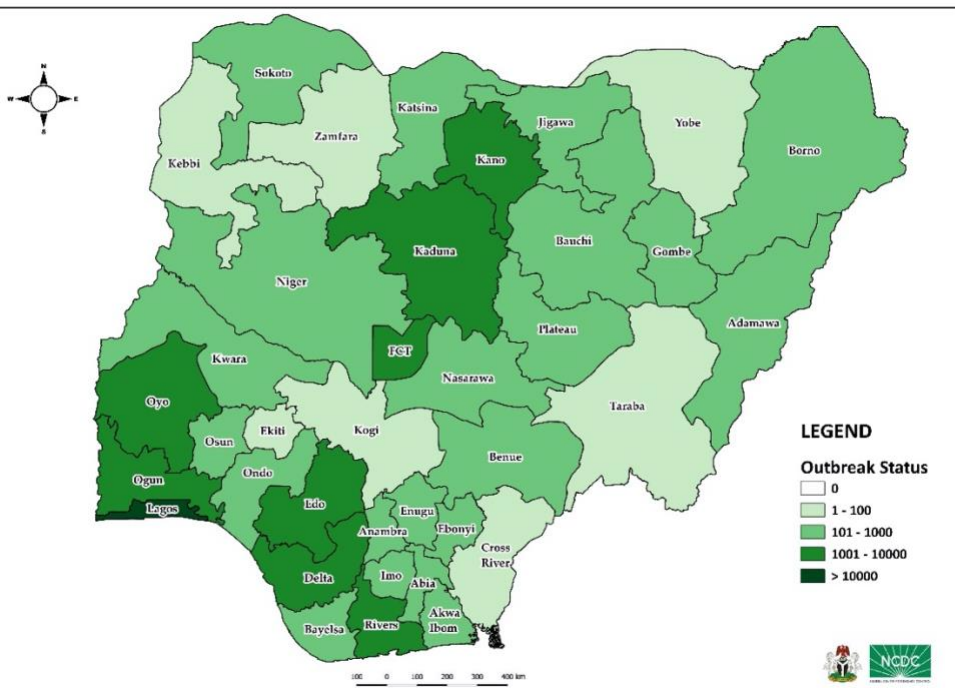
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 13TH JULY 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Five hundred and ninety-five (**595**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from **20** states – Lagos (156), Oyo (141), FCT (99), Edo (47), Kaduna (27), Ondo (22), Rivers (20), Osun (17), Imo (13), Plateau (10), Anambra (8), Nasarawa (8), Benue (5), Borno (5), Kano (5), Ogun (4), Gombe (3), Taraba (3), Cross River (1) and Kebbi (1).
- Two hundred and twenty-four (**224**) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in **13** states – Rivers (73), Edo (40), FCT (20), Lagos (19), Plateau (16), Adamawa (12), Akwa Ibom (12), Kaduna (11), Kebbi (7), Ogun (7), Imo (4), Kano (2) and Gombe (1).
- Four (**4**) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in **four** states – Edo (1), FCT (1), Lagos (1) and Osun (1).
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK29)

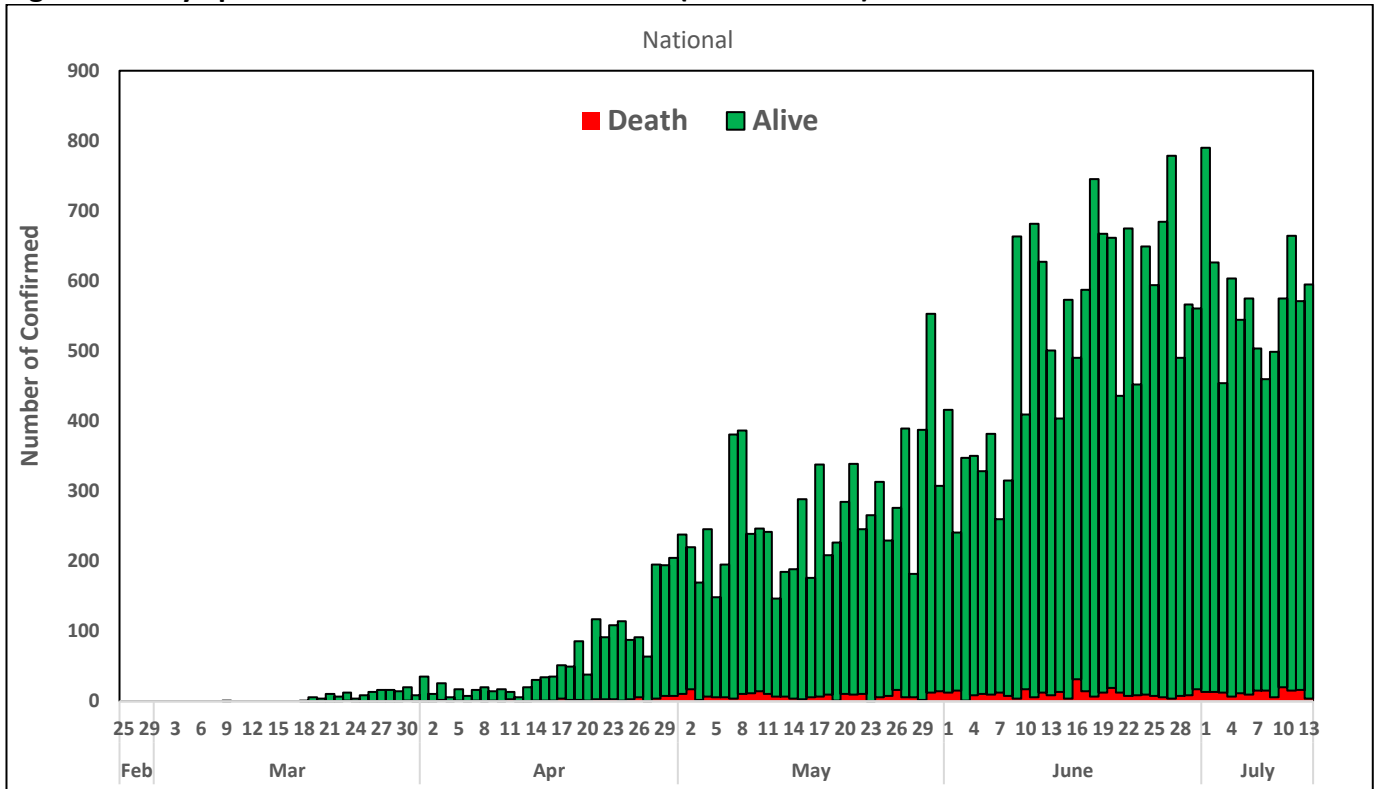
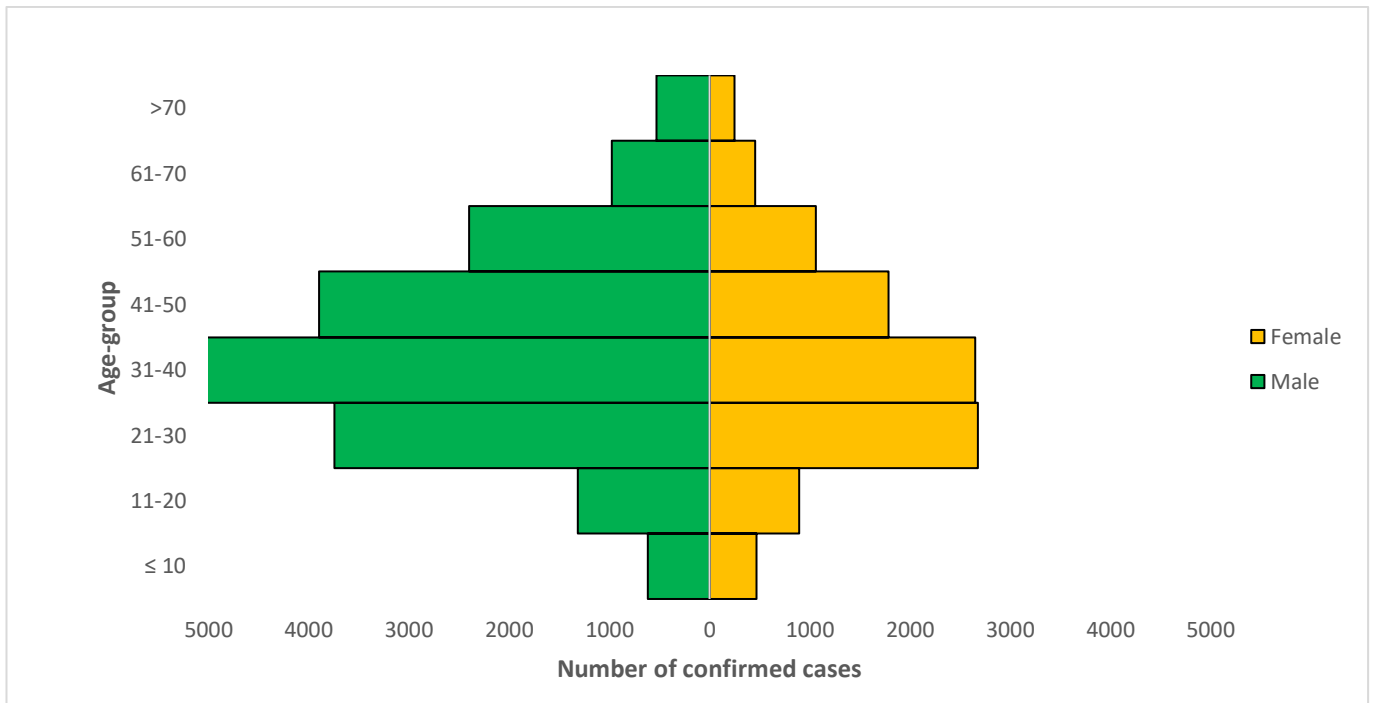


Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK29)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC has launched an online course on [Infection, Prevention and Control \(IPC\) for COVID-19](#) on its e-Learning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued [Guidelines for Conducting Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria](#).
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an [Advisory for Vulnerable Groups](#).
- NCDC has released [guidelines on the re-opening of places for worship](#).
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the [Police and other Law Enforcement Agencies in Nigeria](#)
- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the [case management guidelines](#) (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria and medication being used for the treatment of cases

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Finalisation of new surveillance strategies for COVID-19**
- **Received a total of 274 Persons of Interest/returnees from Malaysia (247), World Food Programme Global Aviation Passengers (21) and United Kingdom (6) in FCT**
- **All POIs/returnees were received, screened and given the travellers kit on arrival at the Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport Abuja (NAIA)**
- **All returnees were issued Covid-19 test appointment**
- **Ongoing optimisation of the Abubakar Tafawa Balewa University Teaching Hospital (ATBUTH), Bauchi Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) laboratory**
- **Completed IPC training for 60 Healthcare workers in Katsina State in collaboration with partners**
- **Carried out IPC assessment of Ituk Mbang Isolation Centre Uyo, Akwa Ibom State**

- **Supplied commodities and Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) to four sample collection centres in the FCT**
- **Deployed additional response material and commodities to all states**
- **Engaged development partners on intervention for preventing COVID-19 at correctional facilities in the country**
- Ongoing support to states to expand human resource capacity for contact tracing
- Completed onsite training on sample collection for personnel in Katsina State
- Completed optimisation of State Specialist Hospital Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) laboratory, Amachara in Abia State
- Commenced the roll out of one-week training of health care workers in Akwa-Ibom State
- Ongoing collaboration with Logistic Management Coordination Units (LMCUs) in states to collect utilisation data
- In line with ongoing clinical research, data collection commenced in treatment centres in Gombe State
- Ongoing engagement with stakeholders on the planned school reopening preparedness strategy
