# COVID-19 OUTBREAK IN NIGERIA Situation Report

S/N: 035 Date: 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2020

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

This is the 35<sup>th</sup> national situation report, following confirmation of the first case of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) in Nigeria on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020. The data in this report is as at 12 midnight on 03/04/2020

- On the 3<sup>rd</sup> of April 2020, 26 new confirmed cases of COVID-19 were recorded in Nigeria
- All new cases were reported from Lagos 11, Osun 8, FCT 3, Edo 3 and Ondo 1
- Currently, there are total of 210 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Nigeria
- The 210 confirmed cases are in 14 States: Lagos 109, FCT 41, Osun 22, Ondo 1, Oyo 8, Akwa
   Ibom 5, Edo 7, Kaduna 4, Ogun 4, Bauchi 3, Enugu 2, Ekiti 2, Benue 1 and Rivers 1
- Of the 210 confirmed cases, 25 (12%) have been discharged, 181 (86%) currently receiving care and 4 (2%) deaths from COVID-19 in Nigeria
- Of the 25 discharged cases, 22 are Lagos State cases, two (2) are Ogun State cases managed in Lagos State (index and second case), and one (1) Ekiti State case.
- The four (4) death cases were managed in UATH Gwagwalada Abuja 2, Lagos 1, and Edo 1
- Of the 210 confirmed cases 93 (44%) have travel history to high risk countries, 35 (17%) are contacts of known confirmed cases and 82 (39%) of cases have incomplete epidemiological information.
- Of the 210 confirmed cases 48% are Males, 24% are females, 28% have incomplete epidemiological information, age group most affected are 31-60 (59%)
- The National EOC is working with affected State EOCs to identify contacts of the new confirmed cases
- A cumulative total of 7868 passengers of interest (POI) identified, and being monitored
- A multi-sectoral national emergency operations centre (EOC), activated at level 3, continues to coordinate national response activities








Fig. 3: Daily Epi-Curve of Confirmed Cases (wk9 – wk14)

### **MAJOR RESPONSE ACTIVITIES**

- Daily laboratory testing capacity has been increased to 1500 a day
- Fully set up expanded laboratory network for COVID-19 across the 6 geopolitical zones with 7 Laboratories activated (NRL, LUTH, NIMR, ACEGID, UCH, ISTH and FETHA)
- Deployment of 40-man surge capacity to Lagos by NCDC/WHO
- Deployment of Rapid Response Team (RRT) to support response in all states with confirmed case(s). Currently 15 RRTs deployed
