
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 22nd May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Two hundred and forty-five (245) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in eighteen (22) states - Lagos (131), Jigawa(16), Ogun (13), Borno (12), Ebonyi (9), Kaduna (9), Oyo (9), Rivers (9), Kano (8), Kwara (7), Katsina (5), Akwa Ibom (3), Sokoto (3), Bauchi (2), Yobe (2), Anambra (1), Bayelsa(1), FCT(1), Gombe (1), Niger (1), Ondo (1) and Plateau (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 35 (34 states + FCT).
- One hundred (100) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in thirteen (13) states - Ogun (24), Bauchi (23), Borno (22), Kano (10), Sokoto (5), Plateau (4), Ondo (3), Yobe (3), Rivers (2), Bayelsa (1), Benue (1), Ebonyi (1) and FCT (1).
- Ten (10) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five (5) states - Yobe (5), Lagos (2), Borno (1), Kaduna (1) and Katsina (1)

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 - WK21)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular respond to the pandemic

- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the *integration of private labs*.
- Guidelines for businesses and employers have been updated
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management quide</u>.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> and <u>Mandatory institutional quideline</u> for returnees to Nigeria to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases.</u>
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Commenced development of sector specific advisories on re-opening
- Conducted high level technical session on strategic outputs of Mid-Action Review (MAR) and identified priority activities for the next phase of the response
- Reviewed Epi-data at the national and subnational for targeted interventions
- Engaged the National Council of Women Society (NCWS) on the use of their expansive network for community sensitisation
- Developed strategic plan for grass root mobilisation
- Trained 101 health care workers on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) in Owerri, Imo state
- Trained 25 health care workers in the military on IPC in Enugu state
- Developed and circulated the National COVID-19 mortality review forms to isolation centres
- Completed the first phase of engagement with traditional rulers and discussed their roles in curtailing the spread of COVID-19 in their domains
- Trained surveillance and laboratory personnel from 39 Local Government Areas (LGAs) in Kano state on safe sample collection, packaging, handling and transportation
- Completed the first phase of engagement with traditional rulers and discussed their roles in curtailing the spread of COVID-19 in their domains
- Completed commodities distribution to Oyo State Ministry of Health, Points of Entries (POEs) and Lagos University Teaching Hospital (LUTH)
- Developed new Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) to track surveillance strategic directions and programmes
