
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 31st AUGUST 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- One hundred and forty-three (143) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 18 states Plateau (35), Kaduna (21), Lagos (19), FCT (13), Ebonyi (9), Adamawa (7), Enugu (7), Katsina (7), Edo (6), Kwara (5), Osun (3), Anambra (2), Kano (2), Niger (2), Ogun (2), Benue (1), Borno (1) and Sokoto (1).
- One hundred and twenty-five (125) discharges have been reported in the last 24 hours in 15 states Ogun (26), Edo (25), Plateau (21), Kaduna (14), Kwara (11), FCT (5), Borno (4), Akwa Ibom (3), Bayelsa (3), Lagos (3), Niger (2), Osun (2), Oyo (2), Rivers (2) and Sokoto (2).
- No deaths were reported in the last 24 hours.
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.
- Confirmed COVID-19 cases globally have passed the **25 million** mark.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK36)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK36)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC recently published the first edition of a quick reference guide on setting up sample collection centre - <u>A step by step quide on setting up a sample collection centre</u>
- NCDC has launched an online course on <u>Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19</u> NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an <u>Advisory</u> for Vulnerable Groups.
- NCDC has released *quidelines on the re-opening of places for worship*.
- NCDC has released <u>Strategies to Improve Surveillance for COVID-19 Guidance for States</u>
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other Law</u> <u>Enforcement Agencies</u> in Nigeria
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or</u> confirmed to have died of COVID-19
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our detailed FAQ document.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for businesses and employers have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management quide</u>.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.

- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases*.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Completed deployment of Surveillance Outbreak Response Management and Analysis System (SORMAS) tool in Kwara and Benue States
- Commenced a 4-day refresher training on biosafety, biosecurity and risk assessment for all laboratories in the network at National Reference Laboratory (NRL), Gaduwa, FCT
- Concluded waste management assessment in Ogun State, Olabisi Onabanjo University Teaching Hospital (OOUTH) and Federal Medical Centre (FMC) Abeokuta
- Currently working with Technical Advisors and state teams to strengthen mobilisation of partners support
- Commenced testing at the Bayelsa State molecular laboratory in Yenagoa

- Support supervision and monitoring visits to various treatment centre Health facilities across FCT (UATH, National Hospital, EHA clinic, UN clinic, This day dome)
- Supplied NCDC Travelers kits to Points of Entry (POE) across the country
- Obtained ethical approvals obtained to conduct clinical management study to determine the management and outcome of COVID-19 cases from the State Ministry of Health (SMOH) and University College Hospital (UCH) Ibadan, Ethical Review Committees (ERCs) Oyo State
- Ongoing technical committee meeting with Federal Ministry of Education on school reopening
