
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 18TH AUGUST 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Four hundred and ten (410) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 16 states Lagos (210), FCT (45), Ondo (30), Plateau (21), Edo (19), Ogun (16), Oyo (13), Nasarawa (12), Bauchi (11), Enugu (10), Kwara (7), Kaduna (6), Anambra (4), Ebonyi (3), Abia (2) and Rivers (1).
- Two hundred and seventeen (217) discharges have been reported in the last 24 hours in 14 states Plateau (57), Rivers (33), Osun (32), Ogun (18), Edo (15), Ebonyi (15), Kaduna (13), Lagos (9), FCT (8), Ekiti (6), Kwara (5), Adamawa (4), Ondo (1) and Bauchi (1).
- Four (4) deaths were reported in the last 24 hours in four states –
 Rivers (1), Ekiti (1), Ondo (1) and Oyo (1).
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.





PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC recently published the first edition of a quick reference guide on setting up sample collection centre A step by step quide on setting up a sample collection centre
- NCDC has launched an online course on <u>Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19</u> NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an <u>Advisory</u> <u>for Vulnerable Groups</u>.
- NCDC has released *quidelines on the re-opening of places for worship*.
- NCDC has released <u>Strategies to Improve Surveillance for COVID-19 Guidance for States</u>
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other Law</u> <u>Enforcement Agencies</u> in Nigeria
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or</u> confirmed to have died of COVID-19
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for businesses and employers have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management quide</u>.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases</u>.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u> <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Supported massive open online course (MOOC) on molecular testing for COVID-19 with 39 persons enrolled at inauguration in collaboration with partners
- Conducted training of trainers for Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) focal persons identified across Secondary and Tertiary Health facilities in Gombe State
- Organised a planning meeting to train officer working in correctional facilities on risk communication and community engagement
- Developed and disseminated advisory on schools reopening to the State Ministries of Health and Public Health Emergency Operations Centres (PHEOCs) leadership
- Developed and disseminated quick reference guide for improved surveillance and sample collection to all State Epidemiologists

- Commenced deployment of Surveillance Outbreak Response Management and Analysis System tool (SORMAS) in Yobe State
- Supported the activation of effective transportation system for movement of COVID-19 cases for referral to higher level of care
- Finalised plans to train laboratorians on the use of Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) diagnostic method across states
- Commenced the final batch of 3-day National Training of Trainers (TOT) for case managers from Federal Tertiary Hospitals and Institutions supporting the COVID-19 outbreak response in the South East and South-South States on 17th August 2020
- Concluded the set-up of triaging areas in secondary health facilities: 43 in Akwa Ibom, 100 in Borno, 35 in Bayelsa
- Ongoing support on Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE) in 23 states in collaboration with partners
