
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 20th SEPTEMBER 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Ninety-seven (97) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 12 states Lagos (46), Kwara (12), Rivers (11), Adamawa (4), Niger (4), Ogun (4), Osun (4), Ekiti (3), Imo (3), Kaduna (3), Plateau (2) and FCT (1).
- One hundred and thirty-eight (138) discharges have been reported in the last 24 hours in eight states – Plateau (75), Kwara (23), Benue (12), Ekiti (10), Kaduna (7), FCT (5), Rivers (4) and Adamawa (2).
- Three deaths were reported in the last 24 hours in three states Adamawa (1), Benue (1) and Kaduna (1).
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.





Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK38)

PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC published second interim guidance Infection Prevention and Control: <u>Recommendations</u> during health care provision for suspected and confirmed cases of COVID-19
- NCDC recently published the first edition of a quick reference guide on setting up sample collection centre <u>A step by step guide on setting up a sample collection centre</u>
- NCDC has launched an online course on <u>Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19</u> NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an <u>Advisory</u> for <u>Vulnerable Groups</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines on the re-opening of places for worship.
- NCDC has released <u>Strategies to Improve Surveillance for COVID-19 Guidance for States</u>
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other Law</u> <u>Enforcement Agencies</u> in Nigeria
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or</u> <u>confirmed to have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our *detailed FAQ document*.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the *integration of private labs*.
- Guidelines for *businesses and employers* have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its *case definition*, *community case definition* and *case management guide*.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an *advisory on the use of face masks*, as well as information on the *Use of Cloth face masks* and *how to make your cloth face masks*.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases.*
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u> <u>the website of the Presidency</u> – including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Added two (2) additional laboratories (Ceder Crest and DNAlabs) to the portal to test international travellers in FCT
- Produced new jingles and shared with Federal Ministry of Environment to increase community mobilisation
- Ongoing deployment of Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) materials and supplies to the laboratories in the network

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- Four (4) additional laboratories added on the Nigeria International Travel Portal (NITP) for Imo, Anambra, Edo and Kano States
- Trained 35 members of staff of Accident and Emergency Bureau on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures in Lagos state
- Deployed eight (8) tonnes of IPC commodities and materials per state
- Developed and disseminated bi-weekly messaging priorities and key messages to stakeholders
