


DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 11th May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Two hundred and forty-two (242) cases were reported in the last 24 hours in 14 states Lagos (88), Kano (64), Katsina (49), Kaduna (13), Ogun (9), Gombe (6), Adamawa (4), FCT (3), Borno (1), Bauchi (1), Ondo (1), Oyo (1), Rivers (1), and Zamfara (1)
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 35 (34 states + FCT).
- One hundred and twenty-four (124) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in twelve (12) states Gombe (43), Lagos (33), Kano (13), Ogun (6), Sokoto (6), Ekiti (5), Ondo (5), Adamawa (4), Jigawa (4), Kaduna (3), Bauchi (1) and Zamfara (1).
- Ten (10) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in four (4) states
 Kano (6), Zamfara (2), Ondo (1), and Rivers (1)
- Three (3) new laboratories activated: University of Port Harcourt Teaching Hospital (UPTH)- Port Harcourt, Rivers State University Teaching Hospital (RSUTH)- Port Harcourt, University of Benin Teaching Hospital PCR (UBTH)- Benin
- The global number of confirmed cases has crossed the 4 million mark.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 - WK20)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK20)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular respond to the pandemic

- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u> and <u>community case definition</u>.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic <u>public health advisories</u> to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases</u>.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Conducted training for case managers on the use of Surveillance Outbreak Response Management Analysis System (SORMAS)
- Reviewed and disseminated discharge criteria for COVID-19 patients
- Deployment of additional commodities and supplies to all teaching hospitals, Federal Medical Centres, Orthopaedic and Psychiatric hospitals in the South-East, South-South and North Central
- Three (3) New Laboratories activated University of Port Harcourt Teaching Hospital (UPTH)-Port Harcourt, Rivers State University Teaching Hospital (RSUTH)- Port Harcourt, University of Benin Teaching Hospital PCR (UBTH)- Benin
- Supervised the screening of 69 Almajiris from Gombe into Jigawa State
- Printed the mandatory institutional quarantine guideline and NCDC CARE kit for the returnees and evacuees
- Developed Home care interim guideline for COVID-19 patients
- Conducted a meeting with all case managers on psychosocial impact of COVID-19 on healthcare providers, coping strategies and promotion of emotional wellbeing
- Engaged traditional religious leaders in 6 LGAs in Kano State on risk communication activities
- Airing of jingles in 6 Radio stations in Kano State
