## HIGHLIGHTS

- One hundred and seventy-six (176) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in 14 states – Lagos (95), Oyo (31), FCT (11), Borno (8), Niger (8), Jigawa (6), Kaduna (4), Anambra (3), Bauchi (2), Edo (2), Nasarawa (2), Rivers (2), Benue (1) and Zamfara (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still **35** (34 states + FCT).
- One hundred and fifty-two (152) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in fourteen (14) states Jigawa (55), Bauchi (28), FCT (20), Rivers (11), Edo (8), Ogun (8), Kebbi (6), Zamfara (5), Kano (3), Bayelsa (2), Borno (2), Kaduna (2), Ondo (1) and Osun (1).
- Five (5) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in three (3) states Borno (2), Kano (2) and Niger (1).



#### Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK20)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK20)



### PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular respond to the pandemic

- Guidelines for *businesses and employers* have been updated
- NCDC has updated its *case definition* and *community case definition*.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an *advisory on the use of face masks*, as well as information on the *Use of Cloth face masks* and *how to make your cloth face masks*.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases*.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u> <u>the website of the Presidency</u> – including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

#### RESPONSE

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Develop sub-national risk-based decision making matrix for risk level assessments at states and LGAs
- Trained first aid workers for all religious groups in Gombe state
- Support provided for screening of Almaijiris coming into Jigawa state
- Completed optimisation of Acunalysis lab in Anambra
- Collaborated with development partners to engage influential religious leaders in Akwa Ibom, Bauchi, Ebonyi, Kebbi, Nasarawa, Plateau, Sokoto and Zamfara states
- Conducted high level technical meeting on the outputs of the National COVID-19 Response Mid-Action Review
- Commenced Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) training specifically for the Almajirai in Kano
- Supportive supervision provided across various mobile screening centres in Edo and Lagos states
- Activated database for tracking of Healthcare Workers (HCWs) infection throughout Nigeria
