COVID-19 OUTBREAK IN NIGERIA Situation Report

HIGHLIGHTS

This is the 24th national situation report, following confirmation of the first case of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) in Nigeria on 27th February 2020. The data in this report is as at 12 midnight on 23/03/2020

- On the 23rd of March 2020, ten new confirmed cases of COVID-19 were recorded in Nigeria with the first death
- Eight of the ten new cases have travel history to high risk countries
- All new cases were reported from FCT (3), Lagos (6) and Edo (1) State
- As at 23rd March 2020, a total of 158 persons have been screened for COVID-19 (6 new) in 15 States (Adamawa, Akwa Ibom, Edo, Ekiti, Enugu, FCT, Kano, Katsina, Lagos, Nasarawa, Ogun, Ondo, Oyo, Rivers and Yobe) out of which 36 were confirmed positive
- The 40 confirmed cases are in six States (Edo, Ekiti, FCT, Lagos, Ogun and Oyo); two cases have been discharged, 37 currently receiving care and one death from COVID-19 in Nigeria
- The National EOC is working with affected State EOCs to identify contacts of the new confirmed cases
- Screening has been heightened at all air, land and sea points of entry into Nigeria
- A cumulative total of 4,144 passengers of interest (POI) identified, and being monitored
- A multi-sectoral national emergency operations centre (EOC), activated at level 3, continues to coordinate national response activities






Fig. 1: Map of Nigeria showing COVID-19 affected States
