




Fig 1. Distribution of cases (Epi Week 51 only)

HIGHLIGHTS

- In Week 51, the number of samples tested decreased to **58,288** from **73,919** reported in week 50. These were reported in **36** states and FCT (Tables 1).
- In Week 51, the number of new confirmed cases increased to 13,674 (23.5%) from 6,406 (8.6%) reported in week 50. These were reported in 26 states and FCT (Tables 1 & 2) and includes backlog of confirmed cases reported from Anambra (8), Borno (159), Kaduna (10), and Lagos (2,436) States and FCT (55)
- In Week 51, the number of discharged cases decreased to 1,013 from 3,791 in week 50.
- There were **37** deaths reported in the last one week (Tables 1 & 4). This includes backlogs of deaths reported from Imo State (16)
- Cumulatively, since the outbreak began in Week **9**, 2020 there have been **237,561** cases and **3,022** deaths reported with a case fatality rate (CFR) of **1.3%** (Tables 1 & 4).
- In Week 51, the number of in-bound international travellers tested was **9,398** of which **668** (7.1%) were positive compared to **522** (6.3%) (out of **8,306** tested) in week 50.
- In Week 51, the number of out-bound international travellers tested was **10,233** of which **1,864** (**18.2%**) were positive compared to **1,464** (**17.4%**) (out of **8,421** tested) in week 50.
- Worldwide, there has been **280,119,931** confirmed COVID-19 cases with **5,403,662 deaths** resulting in a case fatality rate of **2.0%**.




Figure 3: Daily epidemic curve of confirmed cases as reported per day as of 26th December 2021

AGE-GENDER BREAKDOWN




Figure 4: Chart with age and gender breakdown of cases and deaths (WK10, 2020 – WK51, 2021)

IN FOCUS: Sustaining Efforts Towards Epidemic Preparedness

As Nigeria continues to coordinate COVID-19 response activities amidst a fourth wave of the outbreak, the country is strengthening efforts towards protecting the lives of Nigerians. The COVID-19 pandemic response has highlighted the need for resilient systems to better prevent, detect and respond to disease outbreaks, contributing to long-term epidemic preparedness, nationally and globally.

This week, the global public health community observed International Day of Epidemic Preparedness. The day serves to emphasize the need for investments in structures for the response to epidemics timely and even before they occur, leveraging on lessons learnt from the previous outbreaks including the COVID-19 pandemic. It also presents an opportunity for public health institutions to raise awareness on the importance of data sharing, and the exchange of scientific knowledge and best practice at national, regional, and global levels.

The Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), with the Federal Ministry of Health and with the support of other Ministries, Department and Agencies (MDAs) and partners, has built and implemented several structures for epidemic preparedness in Nigeria over the past few years. These include a robust supply chain of laboratory reagents, personal protective equipment (PPE), establishment of public health emergency operation centres (PHEOCs), capacity building for health workers, data officers, epidemiologists, and laboratory personnel nationwide, risk communication and community engagement strategies among others.

Additionally, NCDC employs a One Health approach which integrates the human health, animal health and environmental health sectors for strengthening health security in Nigeria. This ensures a multi-sectoral approach to enhance disease surveillance at points of entry, research into diseases of public health relevance in Nigeria, and other activities to strengthen epidemic preparedness in Nigeria.

As NCDC continues to support and engage with states to improve subnational capacity for the detection, prevention, and response to COVID-19, we strongly urge State Ministries of Health, public and private agencies to invest in sustaining the successes achieved so far. Epidemic preparedness is essential to mitigating the economic and social impact of infectious disease outbreaks.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 which is the highest emergency level in Nigeria. This is led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC) and through the deployment of **61** Rapid Response Teams (RRT) to states. Currently, response activities include:

- Developed plans for the fourth wave
- Ongoing engagement with high burden states on response to the fourth wave
- Ongoing supportive supervision for trained contact tracers in Akwa Ibom, Kaduna, Kano, and Oyo states
- Ongoing case finding and contact tracing in 15 states
- Ongoing media monitoring and social listening for COVID-19 updates and misinformation
- Developed and published a press release on the Celebrate responsibly campaign
- Developed and disseminated FAQs on the Omicron variant
- Held Social and Behavior Change (SBC) material review workshop in collaboration with our partners and MDAs supported by Breakthrough Action Nigeria (BA-N)

- Trained media and spokespersons in Bauchi and Oyo state by BA-N
- Trained Oyo, Sokoto and Bauchi state team on using social media for public health response
- Stakeholders' engagement meeting with persons with disabilities
- Launch celebrate responsibly campaign for the yuletide season
- Ongoing meeting with relevant stakeholders in preparations for the festive period
- Continue follow up with University College Hospital (UCH), Ibadan and FCT on infection rise in the respective health facilities
- Ongoing dissemination of key messaging to focal persons across all States on 4th wave presence and issues regarding intervention prioritization
- Ongoing review and update of the National COVID-19 testing strategy
- Ongoing distribution of 400,000 RDT Kits to the 36 States for increased testing
- Donated 1250 and 1000 RDT Kits to the National Assembly clinic and National Primary Health Care Development Agency respectively
- On-going distribution of RDT kits to Lagos State Biobank Laboratory, Central Public Health Laboratory (CPHL), Yaba and Centre for Disease Control (CDC)
- Distributed Laboratory consumables, PPE, and IPC commodities to all 36 States Ministries of Health and Tertiary Health Care Facilities including the FCT in the month of December
- Continued engagement with states to ensure regular reporting and response continuity
- Continued roll out of antigen based rapid diagnostic test (Ag-RDT) kits in collaboration with partners
- Continued tracking and collation of data from states for strategic coordination
- Ongoing study on the relevance and correlates of positive COVID-19 status among passengers of interest in the International Airports in Nigeria
- Ongoing COVID-19 vaccine effectiveness study in collaboration with National Primary Health Care Development Agency (NPHCDA) and the World Health Organisation (WHO)
- Ongoing data collection on COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy study
- Continued collation of reports on COVID-19 clinical management study
- Ongoing training of Biomedical Engineers on repair and maintenance of Oxygen equipment in collaboration with Clinton Health Access Initiative (CHAI)
- Conducted case management training on Home Base Isolation Care in South-South and South-East Zones
- Ongoing training of Port Health Services (PHS) staff on handling of VIPs, diplomats, cranks etc with support from WHO, Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) and ProHealth International (PHI) in all international airports.
- Continued follow up with states for daily reporting, contact tracing and key challenges
- Ongoing enhanced surveillance at points of entry
- Conducted IPC training for Health workers of Secondary Health facilities in Adamawa, Bauchi, Cross River and Plateau states
- Supported the monitoring of compliance to protocols and NPI during the Shiloh and Holy Ghost Congress events in Ogun State
- Concluded support to the Home-based isolation care training for the South-West and North-West Zones
- Conducted refresher trainings and compliance monitoring across NYSC camps in the country
- Ongoing support for the implementation of Hand Hygiene practices and mentoring in Edo, Ebonyi, Ondo states and the FCT Secondary Health facilities
- Conducted SARS CoV-2 Reference Standard Review in collaboration with WHO & African Society for Laboratory Medicine (ASLM).
