
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 30th May 2020

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Five hundred and fifty-three (553) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in fifteen (15) states Lagos (378), FCT (52), Delta (23), Edo (22), Rivers (14), Ogun (13), Kaduna (12), Kano (9), Borno (7), Katsina (6), Jigawa (5), Oyo (5), Plateau (3), Yobe (3) and Osun (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 36 (35 states + FCT).
- One hundred and fifty-nine (159) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in seventeen (17) states Jigawa (31), Lagos (21), Ogun (18), Katsina (17), Yobe (16), FCT (11), Kaduna (10), Kano (8), Bauchi (6), Borno (5), Rivers (4), Gombe (3), Sokoto (3), Delta (2), Oyo (2), Bayelsa (1) and Plateau (1).
- Twelve (12) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in seven (7) states FCT (3), Lagos (3), Kano (2), Borno (1), Gombe (1), Jigawa (1) and Rivers (1)

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK22)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK22)



#### **PREPAREDNESS**

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our detailed FAQ document
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated
- NCDC has updated its case definition, community case definition and case management guide.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> and <u>Mandatory institutional quideline</u> <u>for returnees to Nigeria</u> to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases*.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
   <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
   information on livelihood and economic support.

#### **RESPONSE**

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Strategic engagement with States`coordination teams in the South East zone, Borno, Jigawa and Katsina on improving sample collection and testing
- Conducted in-depth analysis of Health Care Worker Infections and identified critical control points for targeted intervention
- Finalised plan on engagement of existing community volunteers to conduct house to house sensitisation on COVID-19 at the community level in collaboration with other government agencies
- Completed commodities distribution to State Ministry of Health in Kwara and Ebonyi
- Safety packs distributed to 272 returnees from China
- One new laboratory activated- Bauchi State Reference Molecular Laboratory, Bauchi
- Deployment of infection Prevention and Control (IPC) materials to Ebonyi state Ministry of Health (SMOH), Irrua Specialist Teaching Hospital, Irrua- Edo state and Kwara SMOH, Ilorin
- Provided over 1000 CareKits to returnees in Abuja and Lagos
- Continued engagement with stakeholders on development of guidelines for safe reopening of schools
- Conducted sensitisation of returnees on Standard Infection Prevention and Control (IPC)

- Held a high-level technical session with the national laboratory and state response teams aimed at further improving turnaround time and communication of test results
