
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 16th SEPTEMBER 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- One hundred and thirty-one (131) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 18 states Lagos (45), Kaduna (17), Plateau (17), FCT (16), Delta (6), Niger (6), Kwara (5), Oyo (3), Akwa Ibom (2), Cross River (2), Ekiti (2), Enugu (2), Osun (2), Sokoto (2), Bauchi (1), Ebonyi (1), Katsina (1) and Rivers (1).
- Two hundred and twenty (220) discharges have been reported in the last 24 hours in ten states Enugu (78), Plateau (64), Niger (16), Akwa Ibom (13), Ogun (13), FCT (10), Kaduna (9), Ekiti (8), Ebonyi (7) and Bauchi (2).
- Two deaths were reported in the last 24 hours in one state FCT.
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK38)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK38)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC published second interim guidance Infection Prevention and Control: Recommendations during health care provision for suspected and confirmed cases of COVID-19
- NCDC recently published the first edition of a quick reference guide on setting up sample collection centre - <u>A step by step guide on setting up a sample collection centre</u>
- NCDC has launched an online course on <u>Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19</u> NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an <u>Advisory</u> for Vulnerable Groups.
- NCDC has released guidelines on the re-opening of places for worship.
- NCDC has released <u>Strategies to Improve Surveillance for COVID-19 Guidance for States</u>
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other Law</u> <u>Enforcement Agencies</u> in Nigeria
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated.

- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Ongoing engagement with Ogun and Niger States on activating more laboratories to ensure wider coverage of testing
- Trained 2,454 school teachers at 6 sites in partnership with State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB), Lagelu site 336 in Oyo State

- Deployed Infection Prevention and Control commodities and materials to Edo State in preparation for the forth coming elections
- Developed and shared advisory on on safe school reopening to all states
- Conducted baseline assessment of Orange Network facilities and finalisation of facility workplans on Infection Prevention and Control
- Published the revised guideline on Infection Prevention and Control in COVID-19
- Conducted media appearances to discuss issues around COVID-19 response
