
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 28th May 2020

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- One hundred and eighty-two (182) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in sixteen (16) states Lagos (111), FCT (16), Aqua Ibom (10), Oyo (8), Delta (6), Kaduna (6), Rivers (5), Ebonyi (4), Ogun (4), Kano (3), Gombe (2), Kwara (2), Plateau (2), Bauchi (1), Borno (1) and Kebbi (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 36 (35 states + FCT).
- Ninety-one (91) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in fourteen (14) states Ogun (19), Borno (15), Kebbi (12), Oyo (12), Edo (11), Kaduna (4), Kano (4), Kwara (3), Sokoto (3), Bauchi (2), Ebonyi (2), Ekiti (2), FCT (1) and Gombe (1).
- Five (5) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in three (3) states
  Edo (3), Bayelsa (1) and Rivers (1)

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK22)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK22)



#### **PREPAREDNESS**

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the *integration of private labs*.
- Guidelines for businesses and employers have been updated
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management quide</u>.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> and <u>Mandatory institutional quideline</u> for returnees to Nigeria to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases.</u>
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
   <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
   information on livelihood and economic support.

#### **RESPONSE**

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Continued implementation of priority activities through State Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) focal persons and partners in Local Government Areas (LGAs) with high burden of cases
- Ongoing biosafety training for laboratory staff in Kano state
- Held a high-level technical session with the national laboratory and state response teams aimed at further improving turnaround time and test results communication
- Total number of activated labs now 28
- Conducted a teleconference with stakeholders to review the case management guideline in line with current scientific information
- Engaged with partners to develop work plan for IPC interventions in high burden Local Government Areas across six states
- Engaged with state level partners in 14 states and agreed on areas and modalities of support to states' risk communication activities
