
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 10TH AUGUST 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Two hundred and ninety (290) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 16 states – Lagos (82), Plateau (82), Oyo (19), FCT (18), Edo (16), Kaduna (15), Enugu (9), Ogun (9), Kano (8), Kwara (8), Cross River (5), Ondo (5), Rivers (5), Ekiti (4), Imo (3) and Borno (2).
- One hundred and sixty (160) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in 11 states FCT (45), Rivers (25), Oyo (21), Enugu (15), Imo (13), Edo (11), Ogun (10), Bayelsa (8), Borno (7), Adamawa (4) and Kwara (1).
- Five (5) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in four states Edo (2), Borno (1), Plateau (1) and Rivers (1).
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.





Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK33)

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PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC has launched an online course on *Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19* NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an <u>Advisory</u> <u>for Vulnerable Groups</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines on the re-opening of places for worship.
- NCDC has released <u>Strategies to Improve Surveillance for COVID-19 Guidance for States</u>
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other Law</u> <u>Enforcement Agencies</u> in Nigeria
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or</u> <u>confirmed to have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our *detailed FAQ document*.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the *integration of private labs*.
 Guidelines for *businesses and employers* have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management guide</u>.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an *advisory on the use of face masks*, as well as information on the *Use of Cloth face masks* and *how to make your cloth face masks*.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases.*
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 *available on* <u>the website of the Presidency</u> – including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Deployed technical advisors to support the NCDC/World Bank funded implementation of COVID-19 prioritised activities in the Incident Action Plan in nine states- Abia, Ekiti, Enugu, Gombe, Oyo, Niger Taraba, Sokoto, and Zamfara
- Received a total of 432 Persons of Interest (POIs)/returnees: Germany (28), United Arab Emirates (100) and United Kingdom (304) between 7- 9th August 2020
- All POIs/returnees were received, screened and given the travellers kit on arrival at the Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport Abuja (NAIA)
- All returnees were issued COVID-19 test appointment
- Finalised plan to conduct nationwide training on sample packaging, starting with States with high incidence of specimen transport non-conformity
- Supervised step-down Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) trainings at Local Government Area level in collaboration with Lagos State Primary Healthcare Board

- Commenced the second batch of National Training of Trainers (TOT) for case managers from Federal Tertiary Hospitals and Institutions supporting the COVID-19 outbreak response in the North West and South West States
- Provided technical support to Jigawa and Edo States on measures to curb community resistance and lack of compliance
- Engaged with Presidential Task Force (PTF) and partners to develop new set of selection criteria to identify and update the list of hotspot LGAs
- Training of Principals, heads of private and secondary schools on IPC for school reopening in Ogun State
- Commenced the implementation of the "Clinical Management Study of COVID-19 Cases in Treatment Centres" in Delta State
- Commenced nationwide campaign to commemorate the World Mask day
