


DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 15th JUNE 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Five hundred and seventy-three (573) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from twenty (20) states Lagos (216), Rivers (103), Oyo (68), Edo (40), Kano (21), Gombe (20), FCT (17), Delta (13), Bauchi (12), Plateau (12), Niger (10), Kebbi (9), Ogun (8), Ondo (8), Abia (7), Nasarawa (5), Anambra (1), Benue (1), Borno (1) and Kwara (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 36 (35 states + FCT).
- One hundred and twenty-nine (129) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in twelve (12) states Oyo (26), Ogun (24), FCT (17), Borno (15), Kwara (13), Rivers (11), Yobe (9), Delta (6), Edo (3), Bayelsa (2), Kebbi (2) and Niger (1).
- Four (4) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in three (3) states
 Delta (2), Rivers (1) and Yobe (1).

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK25)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK25)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC has released *guidelines on the re-opening of places for worship*.
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other</u> <u>Law Enforcement Agencies in Nigeria</u>
- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the <u>case management guidelines</u> (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria and medication being used for the treatment of cases
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management quide</u>.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise
 on the <u>management of dead bodies</u>.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases</u>.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u> <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Deployment of response teams to support Port Health Services (PHS) to capture passenger information electronically into SORMAS in Lagos and Abuja airports
- Conducted the first in series of planned IPC training for tertiary and private hospitals supported by partners in Kebbi State
- Guideline for worship places launched and circulated to religious leaders and the public
- Reviewed State's Situation Report (SITREP) template to reflect new data requirements for samples collection
- A total 384 returnees/Persons of Interest (POIs) were received from Egypt-115 and India- 269 (169 in Abuja and 103 in Lagos)
- Shared quarantine guidelines and distributed NCDC care kits to returnees in FCT and Lagos
- Ongoing development of a video on contextual use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) in Treatment Centres
- Finalised guidelines for schools reopening
