

## HIGHLIGHTS

- One hundred and forty-eight (148) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 14 states – Lagos (66), FCT (25), Oyo (13), Plateau (11), Kaduna (7), Rivers (6), Ebonyi (5), Ekiti (4), Ogun (4), Imo (2), Ondo (2), Edo (1), Nasarawa (1) and Taraba (1).
- Fifty-one (51) discharges have been reported in the last 24 hours in seven states Plateau (19), Rivers (16), Edo (8), Bauchi (3), Kaduna (3), Ebonyi (1) and Oyo (1).
- No death was reported in the last 24 hours.
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

#### Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK42)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK42)

## **PREPAREDNESS**

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC published guidance on safe school re-opening: <u>Public Health guidance for Safe School re-opening</u> <u>in Nigeria</u>
- NCDC published second interim guidance Infection Prevention and Control: <u>Recommendations during</u> <u>health care provision for suspected and confirmed cases of COVID-19</u>
- NCDC recently published the first edition of a quick reference guide on setting up sample collection centre <u>A step by step guide on setting up a sample collection centre</u>
- NCDC has launched an online course on <u>Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19</u> NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting Elections</u> <u>During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an <u>Advisory for</u> <u>Vulnerable Groups</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines on the re-opening of places for worship.
- NCDC has released <u>Strategies to Improve Surveillance for COVID-19 Guidance for States</u>
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other Law</u> <u>Enforcement Agencies</u> in Nigeria
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to</u> <u>have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the *integration of private labs*.
- Guidelines for *businesses and employers* have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its *case definition*, *community case definition* and *case management guide*.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an *advisory on the use of face masks*, as well as information on the *Use of Cloth face masks* and *how to make your cloth face masks*.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the *management of pregnant women and nursing mothers* during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases.*
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National Strategy</u> <u>to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on the</u> <u>website of the Presidency</u> – including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

### RESPONSE

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Ongoing training of laboratory staff of Usmanu Dan Fodio Teaching Hospital (UDUTH) on Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) testing for COVID-19
- Ongoing continued support to Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) to develop plans and guidelines, and advocate for resources to facilitate implementation
- Facilitated the engagement between private laboratories operating in the FCT on finalising and signing operational Memorandum of Understanding with the Federal Capital Territory Administration
- Trained Lagos State COVID-19 data collectors on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC)
- Commenced the October monthly distribution of reagents, commodities and consumables to the public laboratories in the network
- Introduced safe school resumption templates used for basic and secondary education under Federal Ministry of Education leadership to Tertiary Institution regulatory bodies for adaptation
