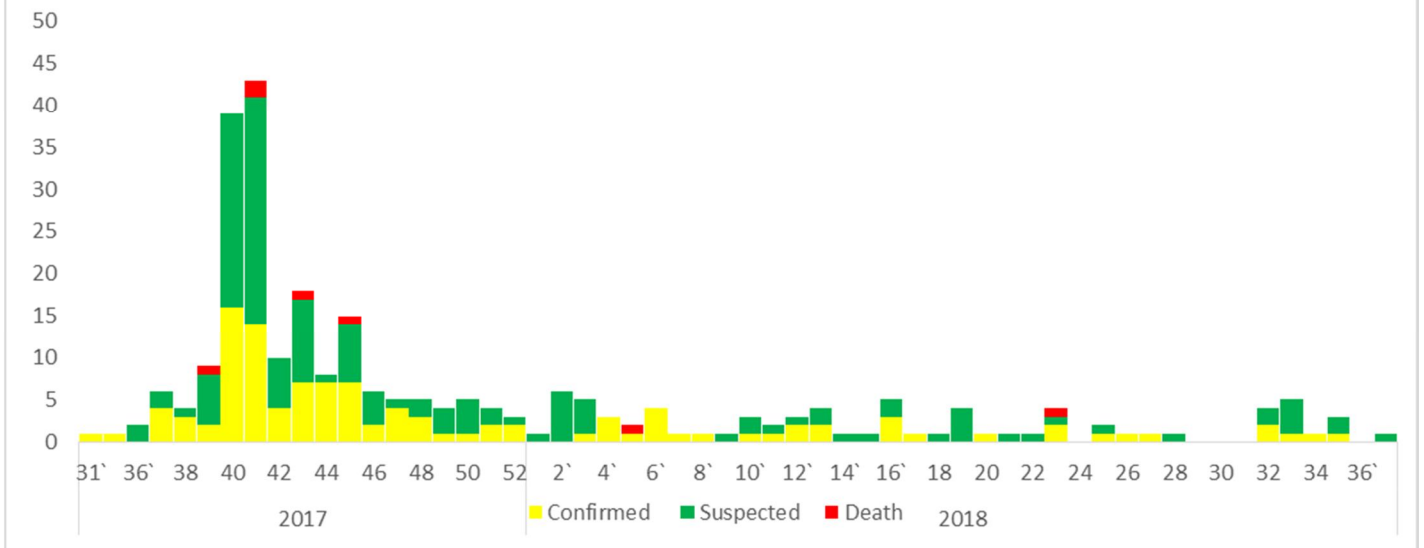

### HIGHLIGHTS

- Two cases of monkeypox were confirmed in the UK on the 7 and 11 September 2018, in people with recent travel history to Nigeria on and reported to NCDC by Public Health England (PHE)
- Case investigations and contact tracing ongoing in the UK and Nigeria
- NCDC is collaborating with PHE to investigate and strengthen further control measures on the two cases confirmed in UK
- A cluster of six suspected cases with epidemiological linkages to one of the cases in the UK has been identified in Rivers State and is being investigated in collaboration with the State team.
- In addition, two new confirmed cases have been recorded in Rivers that are not linked to the cluster described above
- Of a total of 76 cases reported in 2018; there have been 37 confirmed, one probable and two deaths reported in 15 States (Rivers, Akwa-Ibom, Bayelsa, Cross River, Delta, Edo, Enugu, Imo, Lagos, Nasarawa, Oyo, Abia, Anambra, Plateau) and the FCT
- Rivers (34), Bayelsa (20) and Cross River (9) have reported the highest number of confirmed cases since the beginning of the outbreak
- Males are more affected with 79% of confirmed cases
- The most affected age group is 21-40 years (Median Age = 31)
