


REPORTING MONTH: JUNE 2021

HIGHLIGHTS

REPORTING PERIOD: JUNE 1ST - 30TH, 2021

- The Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) continues to monitor reports of yellow fever cases in Nigeria.
- A total of 232 suspected cases were reported from 138 Local Government Areas (LGAs) across 32 states: Abia (16) Adamawa (4), Anambra (20), Bauchi (10), Bayelsa (2), Benue (5), Borno (26), Cross River (3), Delta (12), Ebonyi (3), Edo (3), Ekiti (1), Enugu (19), Gombe (2), Imo (3), Jigawa (6), Kaduna (1), Kano (1), Katsina (34), Kebbi (10), Kogi (3), Kwara (3), Nasarawa (3), Niger (2), Ogun (5), Ondo (3), Osun (3), Oyo (9), Plateau (5), Sokoto (1), Taraba (1), Yobe (8) and Zamfara (5).
- A total of three presumptive positive/inconclusive samples were recorded from Central Public Health Laboratory (CPHL) Lagos (1) from one LGA in Anambra -1 [Ekwusigo (1)], and two from Yusuf Danshoho Memorial Hospital (YDMH) from two states: Katsina-1 [Safana (1)], Zamafara- 1 [Tsafe (1)]
- Nine new confirmed cases from Institut Pasteur (IP) Dakar from; Delta -1 [Aniocha South (1)], Enugu-4 [Nkanu East (3), Nkanu West (1)], Osun -1 [Irewole (1)], Oyo -3 [Ido (2), Ona Ara (1)].
- One death was reported among confirmed cases from Osun State within the review period.



CUMMULATIVE FOR 1ST JANUARY- 30TH JUNE, 2021

- Cumulatively from 1 January 30 June 2021, a total of 858 suspected cases have been reported from 37 states including FCT in 312 LGAs
- The cases were reported from the following states: Abia (16), Adamawa [17], Akwa Ibom [2], Anambra [67], Bauchi [35], Bayelsa [16], Benue [20], Borno [108], Cross River [12], Delta [26], Ebonyi (5), Edo [31], Ekiti [3], Enugu [50], FCT Abuja [6], Gombe (2), Imo [19], Jigawa [28], Kaduna (1), Kano [15], Katsina [87], Kebbi [25], Kogi [10], Kwara [21], Lagos [3], Nasarawa [14], Niger [34], Ogun [16], Ondo [16], Osun [16], Oyo [28], Plateau [13], Rivers [5], Sokoto [5], Taraba [8], Yobe [64] and Zamfara [14] States
- All the suspected cases were reported from 312 LGAs across the 36 states and FCT
- Total of 52 presumptive positive and inconclusive samples were recorded from CPHL Lagos (37), NRL Abuja (12), YDMH Kaduna (2), MDH Abuja (1) and have been sent to IP Dakar for confirmation. These cases were reported from Anambra (8), Bauchi (1), Benue (2), Borno (6), Delta (5), Ebonyi (1), Edo (1), Enugu (15), Imo (1), Kano (1), Katsina (2), Niger (1), Osun (1), Ondo (1), Oyo (4), Yobe (1) and Zamfara (1)
- Twenty-seven (27) confirmed cases have been reported from IP Dakar from: Anambra-2 [Idemili North (1), Onitsha North (1)], Delta-4 [Aniocha South (1), Ika South (2), Patani (1)], Enugu-13 [Nkanu East (11), Nkanu West (1), Udenu (1)], Imo-1 [Ideato North (1)], Niger -1[Munya (1)], Oyo-4 [Ido (2), Ona ara (1), Oyo East (1)] and Ondo -1(Ondo West (1), Osun-1[Irewole (1)]
- Thirteen (48%) of the confirmed cases were from Enugu State
- Three deaths was recorded from Anambra (1), Imo (1) and Osun (1) among suspected cases
- One death among confirmed cases from Osun (1)
- Male to female ratio was 1.3:1 with males 486 (56.6%) and females 372 (43.4%)
- Eighty percent of cases were predominantly aged 30 years and below
- One hundred and thirty-seven (16%) suspected cases had at least one dose of yellow fever vaccine while
 4 (15 percent) among confirmed cases had at least one dose of yellow fever vaccine
- The NCDC is coordinating response activities through the National Multi-agency Yellow Fever Technical Working Group (YF TWG)




Figure 1: Map of Nigeria showing yellow fever outbreak attack rates in affected LGAs, Epi week 1 - 25, 2021




Figure 2: Epicurve of yellow fever cases in Nigeria as at Epi week 25 June, 2021




Figure 3: Trend of confirmed yellow fever cases in Nigeria 2017 – 2021




Figure 4a: Epicurve of yellow fever cases in Enugu State as at Epi week 25 June, 2021




Figure 4b: Map of yellow fever cases in Enugu State as at Epi week 25 June, 2021
