
#### DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 30<sup>TH</sup> JULY 2020

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Four hundred and eighty-one (481) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 15 states FCT (96), Lagos (89), Plateau (68), Ogun (49), Edo (44), Rivers (43), Oyo (25), Osun (23), Delta (15), Enugu (11), Kaduna (7), Kano (7), Bauchi (2), Bayelsa (1) and Yobe (1).
- Two hundred and sixty-six (266) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in 10 states Delta (102), Oyo (49), Kaduna (35), FCT (34), Edo (14), Rivers (13), Borno (8), Ogun (7), Osun (2) and Lagos (2).
- Five (5) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in four states –
  Edo(2), Delta(1), Ondo(1) and Osun(1).
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.





# **PREPAREDNESS**

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC has launched an online course on <u>Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19</u>
  NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an *Advisory for Vulnerable Groups*.
- NCDC has released <u>quidelines on the re-opening of places for worship</u>.
- NCDC has released <u>Strategies to Improve Surveillance for COVID-19 Guidance for States</u>
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other</u>
  Law Enforcement Agencies in Nigeria
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for businesses and employers have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its case definition, community case definition and case management guide.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases*.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
   <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
   information on livelihood and economic support.

#### RESPONSE

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Commenced the roll out of the Surveillance Outbreak and Response Management and Analysis System (SORMAS) tool in 12 states starting with Borno and Jigawa
- Supported the training of 17 state coordinators from partner organisations on contact tracing and deployment of volunteers for surveillance activities
- Concluded the final phase of activation for COVID-19 testing using Abbott equipment in Yobe State
- Assessed the holding area facility in General Hospital (GH), Ogoja, Cross River
- Trained Patent Proprietary Medicine Vendors (PPMVs) in Jigawa State with support from partners
- Disseminated Sallah COVID-19 Advisory
- Distributed Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), commodities and Medicines to the North West states including the treatment centres, Teaching Hospitals and Primary Health care agencies in Jigawa, Kano, Kebbi, Kaduna, Katsina, Sokoto and Zamfara
- Concluded the training of community health care workers on active case search and contact tracing
- Trained personnel of the National Reference Laboratory on use of automated extractors

- Supported all health facilities in Katsina State to activate IPC committees
- Concluded the three-day workshop for Orange Network of IPC collaborators
- Distribution of Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) response materials and commodities to the South Western states including the treatment centres, Teaching Hospitals and Primary Health care agencies in Ondo, Oyo, Ekiti, Ogun, Osun and Lagos
- Deployed PPEs and commodities National Reference Laboratory, Gaduwa FCT
- Finalised plans for distribution of additional response materials and commodities to the North-West states
