
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 20th May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Two hundred and eighty-four (284) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in thirteen (13) states – Lagos (199), Rivers (26), Oyo (19), Borno (8), FCT (8), Plateau (7), Jigawa (6), Kano (5), Abia (2), Delta (1), Ekiti (1), Kwara (1) and Taraba (1).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still **35** (34 states + FCT).
- One hundred and twenty-six (126) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in ten (10) states FCT (27), Bauchi (18), Lagos (17), Zamfara (17), Kwara (13), Kaduna (12), Jigawa (10), Taraba (9), Kano (2) and Oyo (1).
- Ten (10) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in eight (8) states
 FCT (2), Lagos (2), Adamawa (1), Delta (1), Ekiti (1), Gombe (1), Kaduna (1) and Rivers (1).





Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK21)

PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular respond to the pandemic

- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the <u>integration of private labs</u>.
- Guidelines for *businesses and employers* have been updated
- NCDC has updated its *case definition*, *community case definition* and *case management quide*.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an *advisory on the use of face masks*, as well as information on the *Use of Cloth face masks* and *how to make your cloth face masks*.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> and <u>Mandatory institutional quideline</u> <u>for returnees to Nigeria</u> to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the *Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases*.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u> <u>the website of the Presidency</u> – including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Developed new Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) to track surveillance strategic directions and programmes
- Continued monitoring of 977 returnees/ Persons of Interest (POIs) in Abuja and Lagos
- Trained 4th batch of Health Care Workers (HCWs) and Patent Proprietary Medical Vendors (PPMVs) in Kano state
- Reviewed strategies on preventing case mortality and improving data quality with case managers in the states
- Engaged with relevant Ministries, Departments and Agencies with partners for mapping of community mobilisers
- COVID-19 National EOC held response coordination meeting with the states' coordination teams in Bayelsa, Borno, Gombe, Ebonyi, Edo, Kano, Katsina and Oyo
- Developed more jingles on ease of lockdown
- Developed new supply plan, Monitoring & Evaluation framework for COVID-19 commodities
- Ongoing commodities and supplies distribution to the newly activated Laboratories
- Ongoing state level Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) trainings working with partners to step down trainings at community level
