
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 27th May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Three hundred and eighty-nine (389) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in twenty-two (22) states - Lagos (256), Katsina (23), Edo (22), Rivers (14), Kano (13), Adamawa (11), Akwa Ibom (11), Kaduna (7), Kwara (6), Nasarawa (6), Abia (2), Benue (2), Delta (2), Gombe (2), Kogi (2), Niger (2), Oyo (2), Plateau (2), Anambra (1), Borno (1), Imo (1) and Ogun (1).
- One new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours - Kogi. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is now 36 (35 states + FCT).
- One hundred and sixteen (116) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in nine (9) states – Lagos (87), Rivers (11), Kaduna (6), Plateau (4), Zamfara (3), Adamawa (2), Akwa Ibom (1), FCT (1) and Kano (1).
- Five (5) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in three (3) states - Kano (3), Adamawa (1) and Edo (1)

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK22)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK22)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our detailed FAQ document
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the *integration of private labs*.
- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management quide</u>.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> and <u>Mandatory institutional quideline</u> <u>for returnees to Nigeria</u> to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases.</u>
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Total number of activated labs now 28
- Conducted a teleconference with stakeholders to review the case management guideline in line with current scientific evidence
- Engaged with partners to develop work plan for Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) interventions in high burden Local Government Areas across six states
- Engaged with state level partners in 14 states and agreed on areas and modalities of support to states risk communication activities
- Activation of Afriglobal Medicare laboratory, Ogun and Sahel centre for Molecular Diagnostics and Research, Katsina
- Ongoing optimisation of Central Public Health Laboratory, Lagos (CPHL), National Intelligence Agency, Abuja and a state-owned laboratory in Bauchi
- Completed commodities distribution to National Hospital, Abuja and for the institutional isolation centres for returnees
- Developed community engagement strategies in collaboration with partners
- Ongoing IPC training of additional healthcare workers in Kano state
- Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) training for Safe Burial team and ambulance drivers in Borno state
- Ongoing supportive supervision of isolation centres and treatment centres in Edo, FCT, Jigawa, Lagos and Osun
- In Federal Capital Territory, Abuja 59 POIs/returnees from other countries were received and undergoing Isolation
