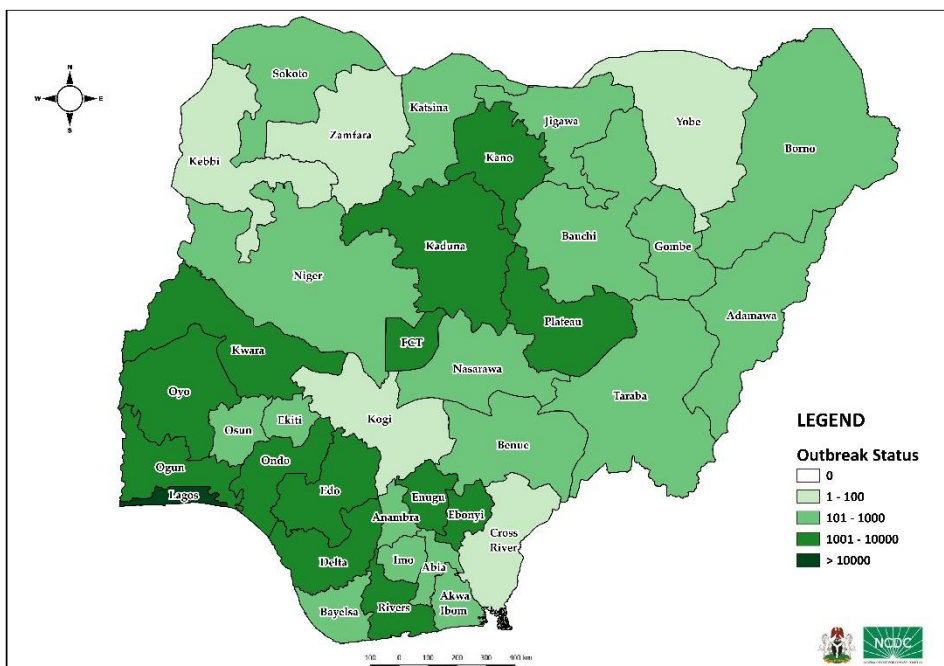
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 9TH OCTOBER 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- One hundred and fifty-one (**151**) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from **10** states – Lagos (71), Ogun (26), Kaduna (17), Osun (10), Oyo (8), FCT (6), Rivers (6), Plateau (5), Akwa Ibom (1) and Ekiti (1)
- Sixty-three (**63**) discharges have been reported in the last 24 hours in **six** states – Plateau (27), Rivers (24), Osun (5), Kaduna (3), FCT (2) and Ogun (2).
- **No** death was reported in the last 24 hours.
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK41)

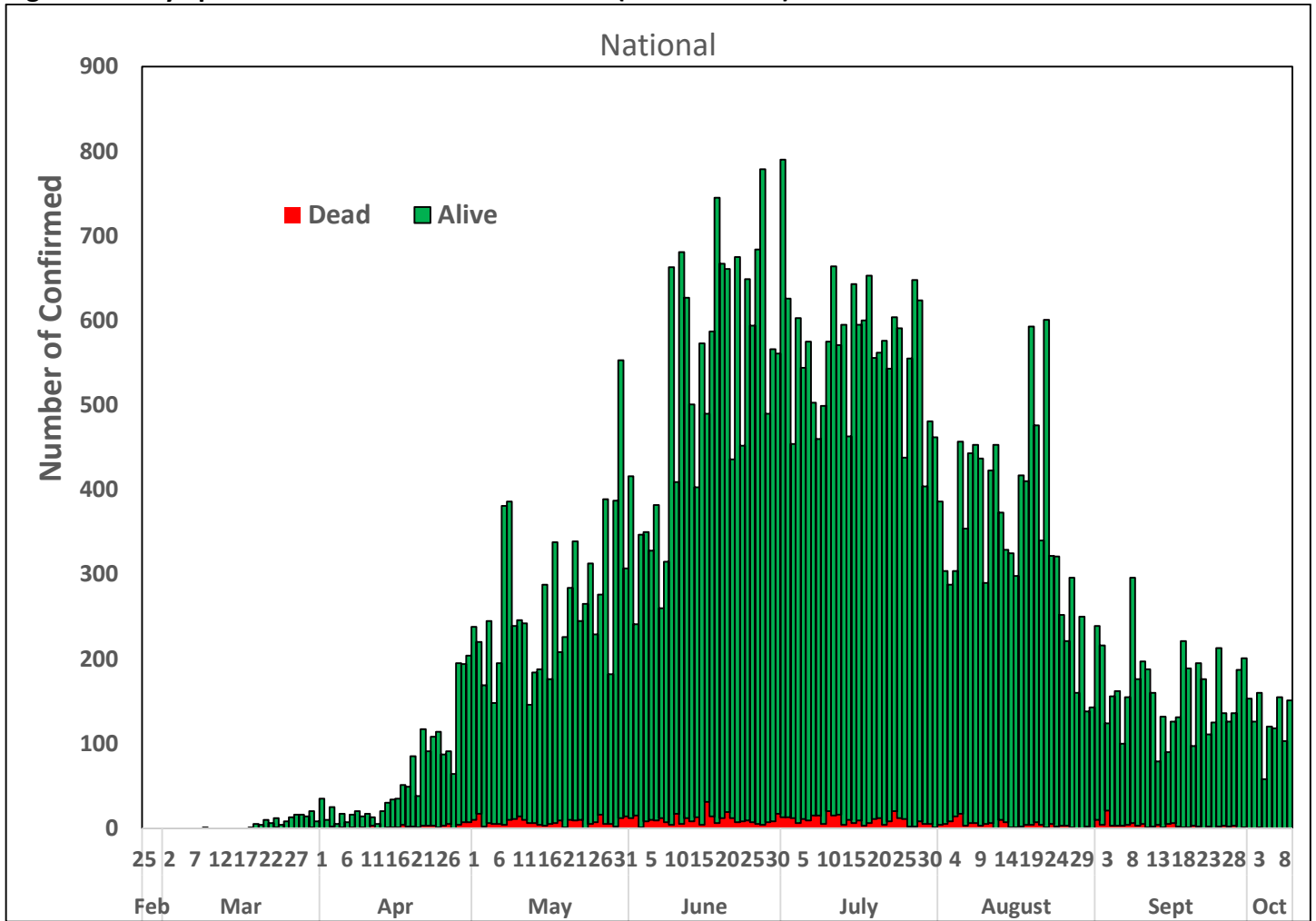
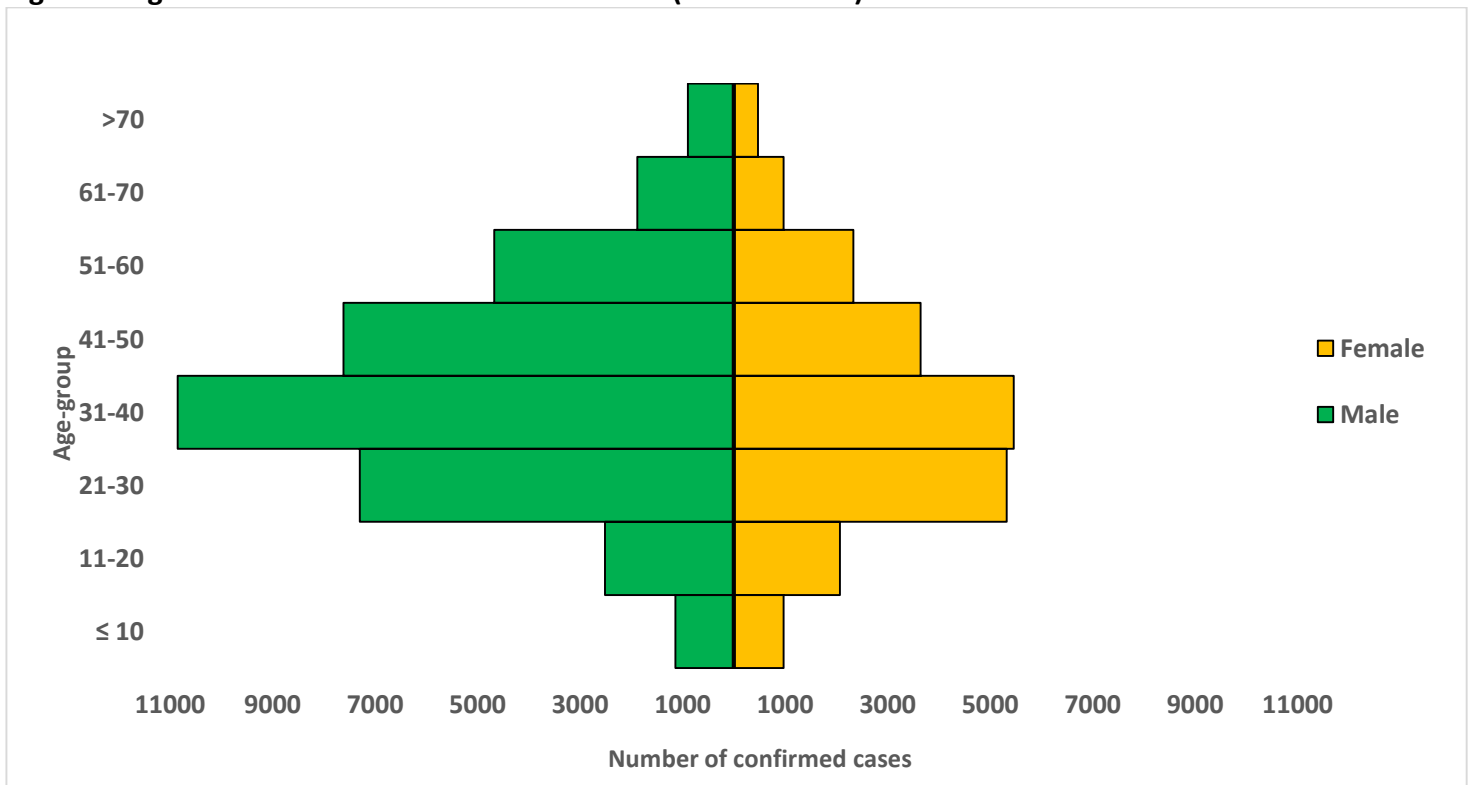


Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK41)

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- **Ongoing optimisation of a new public health laboratory in Minna, Niger State**
- **Trained 120 health workers (Doctors and Nurses) on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) in Kaduna State**
- Built capacity and sensitised 171 teachers on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) across three Senatorial zones in Kaduna State
- Trained risk communication team, town announcers and community mobilisers in Ebonyi and Akwa Ibom States
- Ongoing optimisation of a new PCR laboratory in Usman Danfodio University Teaching Hospital (UDUTH), Sokoto State
