# COVID-19 OUTBREAK IN NIGERIA Situation Report S/N: 025

# HIGHLIGHTS

This is the 25<sup>th</sup> national situation report, following confirmation of the first case of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) in Nigeria on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020. The data in this report is as at 12 midnight on 24/03/2020

- On the 24<sup>th</sup> of March 2020, **four** new confirmed cases of COVID-19 were recorded in Nigeria
- All new cases were reported from Bauchi (1), FCT (1), Ogun (1) and Lagos (1) State
- As at 24<sup>th</sup> March 2020, a total of 178 persons have been screened for COVID-19 (4 new) in 16 States (Adamawa, Akwa Ibom, Bauchi, Edo, Ekiti, Enugu, FCT, Kano, Katsina, Lagos, Nasarawa, Ogun, Ondo, Oyo, Rivers and Yobe) out of which 44 were confirmed positive
- The 44 confirmed cases are in seven States (Edo, Ekiti, FCT, Lagos, Ogun, Oyo and Bauchi); two cases have been discharged, 41 currently receiving care and **one death** from COVID-19 in Nigeria
- The National EOC is working with affected State EOCs to identify contacts of the new confirmed cases
- Screening has been heightened at all air, land and sea points of entry into Nigeria
- A cumulative total of 4,370 passengers of interest (POI) identified, and being monitored
- A multi-sectoral national emergency operations centre (EOC), activated at level 3, continues to coordinate national response activities

### **MAJOR RESPONSE ACTIVITIES**

- Six laboratories with PCR testing capacity to be assessed and added to existing laboratory network for COVID-19 sample testing
- Daily EOC meetings held at NCDC, Lagos, Ekiti and FCT
- Contact tracing of new confirmed cases commenced
