
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 21st AUGUST 2020

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Three hundred and forty (340) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 19 states Kaduna (63), FCT (51), Plateau (38), Lagos (33), Delta (25), Gombe (21), Adamawa (21), Edo (20), Katsina (17), Akwa Ibom (11), Ekiti (10), Rivers (9), Ondo (5), Ebonyi (4), Cross River (3), Ogun (3), Sokoto (2), Imo (2) and Nasarawa (2)
- Three hundred and sixteen (316) discharges have been reported in the last 24 hours in 16 states Borno (54), Plateau (53), Kaduna (47), Kano (45), Adamawa (36), Lagos (28), Akwa Ibom (12), FCT (11), Ebonyi (10), Ekiti (6), Edo (5), Ogun (3), Rivers (2), Osun (2), Gombe (1) and Bayelsa (1).
- Four (4) deaths were reported in the last 24 hours in two states –
  Adamawa (3) and Ogun (1).
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK34)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK34)



#### **PREPAREDNESS**

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC recently published the first edition of a quick reference guide on setting up sample collection centre - <u>A step by step quide on setting up a sample collection centre</u>
- NCDC has launched an online course on <u>Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19</u> NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an <u>Advisory</u> <u>for Vulnerable Groups</u>.
- NCDC has released *quidelines on the re-opening of places for worship*.
- NCDC has released <u>Strategies to Improve Surveillance for COVID-19 Guidance for States</u>
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other Law</u> <u>Enforcement Agencies</u> in Nigeria
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our *detailed FAQ document*.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for *businesses and employers* have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management quide</u>.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases</u>.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u> <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

#### **RESPONSE**

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Oriented technical advisors on strategies for implementation of State COVID-19 Incident Action Plan (IAP) and deployed them to 19 States
- Facilitated the accreditation/licensing of four (4) additional private laboratories for COVID-19 testing by the Medical Laboratory Science Council of Nigeria (MLSCN)
- Conducted Training of Trainers (ToT) workshop on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) for Doctors under the auspices of the Nigeria Medical Association (NMA) and health workers in Anambra State
- Deployed a month stock of IPC materials to laboratories in the network
- Deployed 360 android phones procured for Local Government Area (LGA) Health Promotion Officers (HPOs) for reporting Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE) activities

- Provided support in setting up of sample collection sites in 20 Local Government Areas (LGAs) in Lagos State
- Conducted mortality review of COVID-19 cases in Edo State
- Concluded plans to include biosafety/biosecurity learning components in the proposed roll out of training for laboratory staff
- Provided on the job training and supportive supervision of health workers at Mbanefo Private Hospital, Enugu
- Supported facilitation in the ongoing training of Red Cross community volunteers in 23 states
