
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 8th JUNE 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Three hundred and fifteen (315) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours in fourteen (14) states Lagos (128), FCT (34), Rivers (32), Edo (28), Oyo (22), Kaduna (20), Gombe (13), Ogun (8), Delta (7), Kwara (7), Kano (5), Plateau (5), Bauchi (4) and Katsina (2).
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 36 (35 states + FCT).
- Eighty-one (81) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in nine
 (9) states Kano (27), Rivers (16), Katsina (10), Bayelsa (9), Edo (5), FCT (5), Kaduna (4), Plateau (4) and Osun (1).
- Seven (7) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in three (3) states Lagos (5), Kano (1) and Katsina (1).

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 - WK24)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK24)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the
 <u>case management guidelines</u> (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria
 and medication being used for the treatment of cases
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the <u>integration of private labs</u>.
- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its case definition, community case definition and case management guide.
- NCDC releases periodic <u>public health advisories</u> to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise
 on the <u>management of dead bodies</u>.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> and <u>Mandatory institutional quideline</u> for returnees to Nigeria to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases</u>.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- New lab activated in Oyo Biorepository and Clinical Virology, University College Hospital (UCH) Ibadan
- Ongoing monitoring of 305 returnees/evacuees: 268 (China) and 37 (other countries) in the FCT
- Deployment of response supplies to all treatment centres, Teaching Hospitals, Federal Medical Centres and State Ministries of Health in the North East geopolitical zone
- Ongoing review of strategy for community engagement with all stakeholders and partners
- Trained 15 personnel responsible for safe burial among Muslim community in Gwarinpa, Abuja
- Continuous identification and supervision of IPC focal persons in all treatment centres in the country
- Supported in evacuating two ill returnees in the FCT to a tertiary health facility for management
- Conducted training on risk communication and virtual reporting for media practitioners across the country
- Media appearances on radio and television on COVID-19 response
- Developed and disseminated contents for SMS
- Ongoing deployment of response supplies to Ekiti, Lagos, Ogun, Ondo, Osun and Oyo
- Shared strategies to improve sample collection with states
