


DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC by Midnight 10th May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Two hundred and forty-eight (248) cases were reported in the last 24 hours in 17 states Lagos (81), Jigawa (35), Borno (26), Kano (26), Bauchi (20) ,FCT (13), Edo (12), Sokoto (10), Zamfara (7), Kwara (4), Kebbi (4), Gombe (2), Taraba (2), Ogun (2), Ekiti (2), Osun (1) and Bayelsa (1)
- No new state recorded a confirmed COVID-19 case in the last 24 hours. The total number of states including FCT that have reported at least one confirmed case in Nigeria is still 35 (34 states + FCT).
- Sixty-five (65) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in nine (9) states Lagos (21), Kano (18), Borno (12), Katsina (7), Sokoto (3), Edo (1), Kebbi (1), Oyo (1) and Taraba (1).
- Seventeen (17) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in eight (8) states Kano (8), Sokoto (3), Borno (1), Gombe (1), Jigawa (1), Katsina (1), Kebbi (1) and Ogun (1).
- Three new laboratories activated:
 - University of Port Harcourt Teaching Hospital (UPTH)- Port Harcourt
 - Rivers State University Teaching Hospital (RSUTH)- Port Harcourt
 - University of Benin Teaching Hospital PCR (UBTH)- Benin

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 - WK19)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK19)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular respond to the pandemic

- Guidelines for *businesses and employers* have been updated
- NCDC has updated its case definition and community case definition.
- Ahead of the Ramadan fasting period, an <u>Advisory for Ramadan</u> has been issued.
- NCDC releases periodic <u>public health advisories</u> to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- NCDC has released a <u>Self-Isolation and Quarantine Guide</u> to help those who are exposed to COVID-19 confirmed cases or returnees to Nigeria.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases.</u>
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Printed the mandatory institutional quarantine guideline and NCDC CARE kit for the returnees and evacuees
- Developed Home care interim guideline for COVID-19 patients
- Commenced assessment of the Kebbi Medical Centre Isolation facility
- Initiated IPC training for Air Force Staff
- Finalisation of the plan for operational funding support for COVID-19 response in all 36 states plus the FCT
- Conducted a meeting with all case managers on psychosocial impact of COVID-19 on healthcare providers, coping strategies and promotion of emotional wellbeing
- Engaged traditional religious leaders in 6 LGAs in Kano State on risk communication activities
- Airing of jingles in 6 Radio stations in Kano State
