
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 11<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST 2020

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Four hundred and twenty-three (423) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 22 states - Lagos (117), FCT (40), Ondo (35), Rivers (28), Osun (24), Benue (21), Abia (19), Ogun (19), Ebonyi (18), Delta (17), Kwara (17), Kaduna (15), Anambra (14), Ekiti (11), Kano (9), Imo (6), Gombe (4), Oyo (3), Taraba (3), Bauchi (1), Edo (1) and Nasarawa (1).
- Two hundred and sixty-three (263) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in **13** states – Kwara (89), Rivers (46), Benue (30), Kaduna (29), Delta (21), Ogun (18), FCT (9), Lagos (6), Kano (5), Ondo (4), Bauchi (2), Ekiti (2) and Gombe (2).
- Six (6) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in five states -Lagos (2), Delta (1), Kwara (1), Plateau (1) and Rivers (1).
- All 36 states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK33)





#### **PREPAREDNESS**

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- NCDC has launched an online course on <u>Infection, Prevention and Control (IPC) for COVID-19</u> NCDC eLearning platform
- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an <u>Advisory</u> for <u>Vulnerable Groups</u>.
- NCDC has released *guidelines on the re-opening of places for worship*.
- NCDC has released <u>Strategies to Improve Surveillance for COVID-19 Guidance for States</u>
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other Law</u> <u>Enforcement Agencies</u> in Nigeria
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or confirmed to have died of COVID-19</u>
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for businesses and employers have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management guide</u>.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise on the *management of dead bodies*.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases</u>.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> <u>Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria</u> document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u> <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and information on livelihood and economic support.

#### **RESPONSE**

On 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Commenced the training of over 20 researchers in Delta State on the protocol and data collection tool for a prospective cohort study
- Launched the World Mask Week campaign during the Presidential Task Force press briefing by the Honourable Minister of Health and DG NCDC
- Deployment of technical experts to support the NCDC/World Bank funded implementation of COVID-19 prioritised activities in nine states- Gombe, Oyo, Abia, Zamfara, Enugu, Taraba, Sokoto Ekiti and Niger
- Received a total of 432 Persons of Interest (POIs)/returnees: Germany (28), United Arab Emirate (100) and United Kingdom (304) between 7 9th August 2020
- All POIs/returnees were received, screened and given the travellers kit on arrival at the Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport Abuja (NAIA)
- All returnees were issued COVID-19 test appointment

- Finalised plan to conduct Nationwide training on sample packaging, starting with States with high incidence of specimen transport non-conformity
- Supervised step-down IPC trainings at LGA level in collaboration with LSPHCB
- Finalised the COVID-19 Operational Research Agenda to inform the National COVID-19 EOC on relevant fundamental research questions to be advanced across its response pillars
- Provided technical support to Jigawa and Edo States on measures to curb community resistance and lack of compliance
