

Monkeypox Outbreak in Nigeria

Situation Report (No. 004)

Highlights

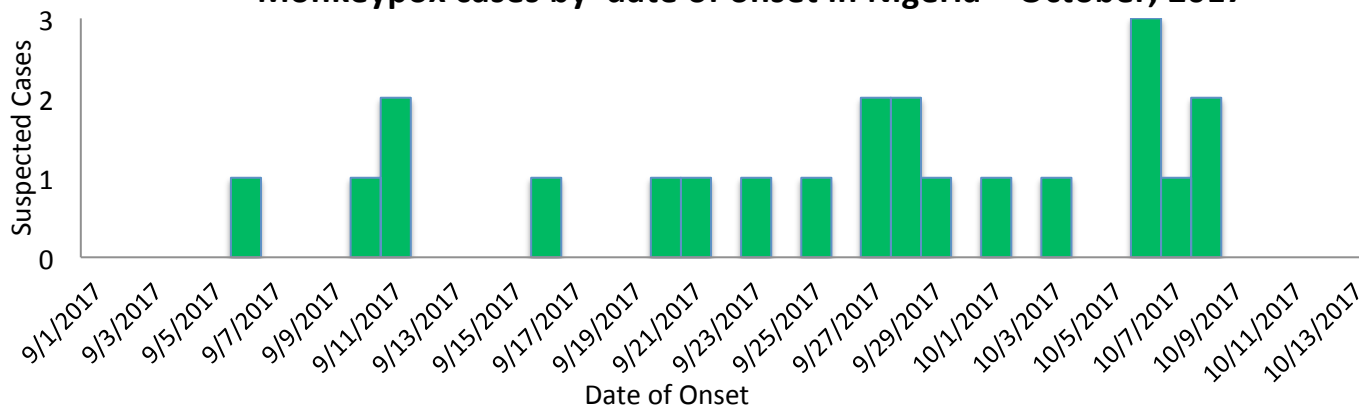
- The Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) continues to coordinate the response through its activated Emergency Operations Centre (EOC)
- **Up to Oct. 19, we have confirmed three cases of monkeypox in Bayelsa State only**
- Outbreak response coordination in Bayelsa is being strengthened with support from a national rapid response team
- A total of 22 **SUSPECTED** cases have been reported in Bayelsa with eight cases still on admission and no death recorded
- Since the onset of the outbreak, 86 **SUSPECTED** cases have been recorded from 10 States and the Federal Capital Territory (FCT). All are being investigated. No confirmation outside Bayelsa State.
- Active engagement with the public is ongoing to increase awareness on preventive measures and allay fear

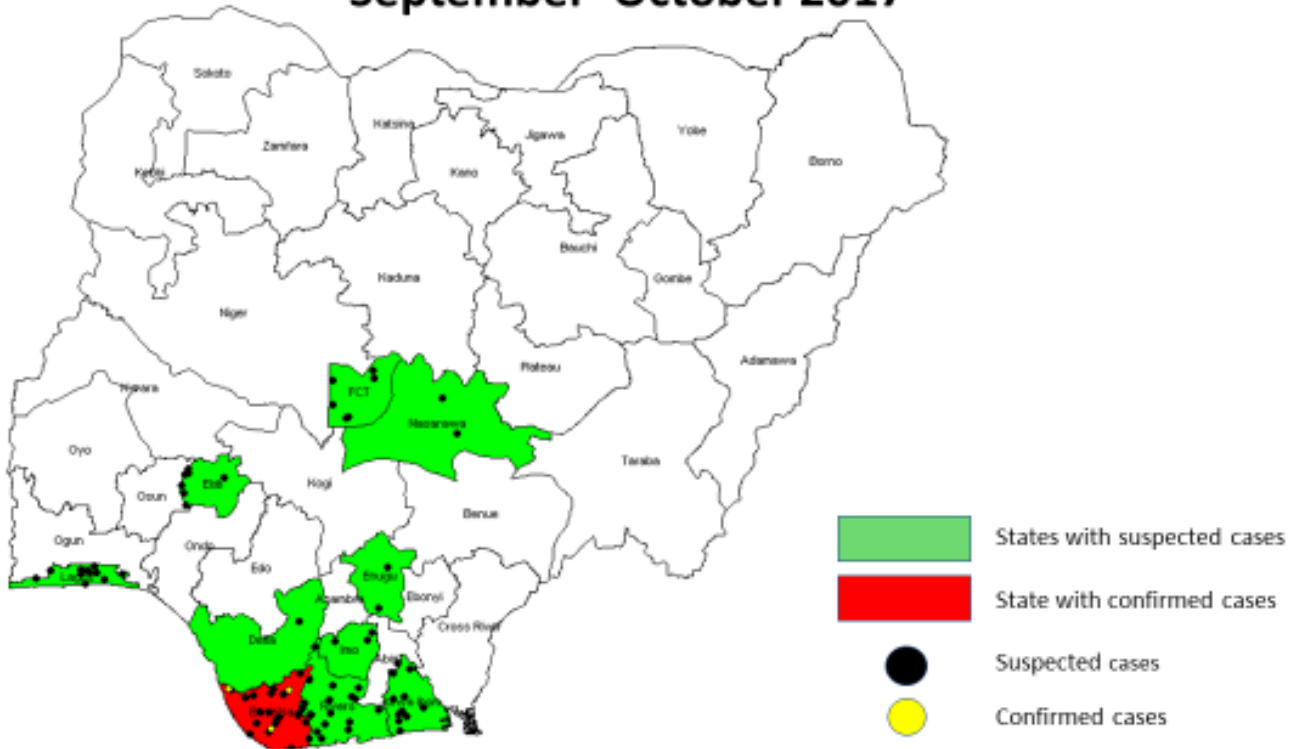
- Three laboratory confirmed cases from Bayelsa
- A total of 86 suspected cases have been reported from 10 States (Akwa Ibom, Bayelsa, Cross River, Delta, Ekiti, Enugu, Imo, Lagos, Nasarawa, Rivers) and the FCT
- Epidemiological linkage demonstrated among three cases in Bayelsa State
- Of the 86 suspected cases, a total of 83 samples have been received so far at the National Reference Laboratory (NRL) for investigation
- Male to female ratio is 3:1
- The most affected age group is 21-30 years
