 COVID-19 OUTBREAK IN NIGERIA

Situation Report

HIGHLIGHTS

This is the 37th national situation report, following confirmation of the first case of coronavirus disease (COVID-19) in Nigeria on 27th February 2020. The data in this report is as at 12 midnight on 05/04/2020

- On the 5th of April 2020, 18 new confirmed cases of COVID-19 were recorded in Nigeria with 1 new death
- All new cases were reported from Lagos11, FCT 4, Edo 2 and Kaduna 1
- Currently, there are total of 232 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Nigeria
- The 232 confirmed cases are in 14 States: Lagos 120, FCT 47, Osun 20, Oyo 9, Edo 9, Bauchi 6, Akwa Ibom 5, Kaduna 5, Ogun 4, Enugu 2, Ekiti 2, Ondo 1, Benue 1 and Rivers 1
- Of the 232 confirmed cases, 33 (14%) have been discharged, 194 (84%) currently receiving care and 5 (2%) deaths from COVID-19 in Nigeria
- Of the 33 discharged cases, 30 are Lagos State cases, two (2) are Ogun State cases managed in Lagos State (index and second case), and one (1) Ekiti State case.
- The five (5) death cases were managed in Abuja 2, Lagos 2, and Edo 1
- Of the 232 confirmed cases 101 (44%) have travel history to high risk countries, 35 (15%) are contacts of known confirmed cases and 96 (41%) of cases have incomplete epidemiological information
- Of the 232 confirmed cases 70% are Males, 27% are females, 3% have incomplete epidemiological information, age group most affected are 31-50 (39%)
- The National EOC is working with affected State EOCs to identify contacts of the new confirmed cases
- A cumulative total of **8881** passengers of interest (POI) identified, and being monitored
- A multi-sectoral national emergency operations centre (EOC), activated at level 3, continues to coordinate national response activities






Fig. 2: Map of Nigeria showing 9 COVID-19 testing laboratories





Fig. 3: Daily Epi-Curve of Confirmed Cases (wk9 - wk 14)



MAJOR RESPONSE ACTIVITIES

- Daily laboratory testing capacity has been increased to 1500 a day
- Deployment of COVID-19 starter packs to 21 tertiary institutions and federal medical centers to North central, North West and North East
- Fully set up expanded laboratory network for COVID-19 across the 6 geopolitical zones with 9 laboratories activated (NRL, DRL, IDH, LUTH, NIMR, ACEGID, UCH, ISTH and FETHA)
- Deployment of Rapid Response Team (RRT) to support response in all states with confirmed case(s). Currently 15 RRTs deployed
