
DATA AS REPORTED AND ACCURATE BY NCDC AS AT MIDNIGHT 7TH JULY 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Five hundred and three (503) confirmed cases were reported in the last 24 hours from 20 states Lagos (153), Ondo (76), Edo (54), FCT (41), Enugu (37), Rivers (30), Benue (24), Osun (20), Kaduna (15), Kwara (13), Abia (9), Borno (8), Plateau (6), Taraba (5), Kano (3), Ogun (3), Kebbi (2), Nasarawa (2), Bayelsa (1) and Gombe (1).
- Two hundred and eighty (280) cases were discharged in the last 24 hours in 21 states Ebonyi (57), Edo (40), FCT (28), Osun (25), Plateau (22), Enugu (20), Lagos (15), Niger (12), Imo (11), Ogun (11), Bauchi (10), Bayelsa (10), Kebbi (5), Gombe (3), Benue (2), Borno (2), Oyo (2), Rivers (2), Kaduna (1), Kwara (1) and Taraba (1)
- Fifteen (15) deaths were recorded in the last 24 hours in eight states
 Edo (4), Ebonyi (3), Imo (2), Rivers (2), Benue (1), Borno (1), Enugu
 (1) and Lagos (1).
- All **36** states in Nigeria, and the FCT, have reported a confirmed case.

Figure 2: Daily Epidemic Curve of Confirmed Cases (WK9 - WK28)





Figure 3: Age-Sex Distribution of Confirmed Cases (WK9 – WK28)



PREPAREDNESS

Since the confirmation of the first case on 27th February 2020, the NCDC has released advisories and statements to help Nigerians and affected groups in particular to respond to the pandemic

- Ahead of forthcoming elections in the country, NCDC has issued a <u>Guidelines for Conducting</u> <u>Elections During the COVID-19 Outbreak in Nigeria</u>.
- To protect our elders, and those with pre-existing medical conditions, NCDC has issued an *Advisory for Vulnerable Groups*.
- NCDC has released *quidelines on the re-opening of places for worship*.
- The Nigeria Police Force has released COVID-19 operational guidelines for the <u>Police and other</u> <u>Law Enforcement Agencies in Nigeria</u>
- NCDC and the Department of Hospital Services (Federal Ministry of Health) have updated the <u>case management guidelines</u> (version 3) with reviewed changes such as the discharge criteria and medication being used for the treatment of cases
- Guidelines have been issued for the <u>safe transportation of remains of persons suspected or</u> confirmed to have died of COVID-19
- Information on diagnostics of the COVID-19 virus can be found in our <u>detailed FAQ document</u>.
- To increase our testing capacity, NCDC has issued guidelines for the integration of private labs.
- Guidelines for <u>businesses and employers</u> have been updated.
- NCDC has updated its <u>case definition</u>, <u>community case definition</u> and <u>case management guide</u>.
- NCDC releases periodic *public health advisories* to Nigerians on the COVID-19 disease.
- To adhere to post-lockdown measures, NCDC has released an <u>advisory on the use of face masks</u>, as well as information on the <u>Use of Cloth face masks</u> and <u>how to make your cloth face masks</u>.
- NCDC has released guidelines for the <u>management of pregnant women and nursing mothers</u> during the pandemic.
- To address burials of loved ones who die from COVID-19, guidelines have been issued to advise
 on the management of dead bodies.
- For health centres managing cases, the following documents have been released- a guideline for the <u>Rational Use of Personal Protective Equipment in the care of COVID-19 cases</u>.
- As part of plans to increase the testing capacity of the country, the NCDC published a <u>National</u> Strategy to Scale Up Access to Coronavirus Disease Testing in Nigeria document.
- The Presidential Task Force has published policies and announcements on COVID-19 <u>available on</u>
 <u>the website of the Presidency</u> including presidential addresses, task force updates and
 information on livelihood and economic support.

RESPONSE

On 28th February 2020, a multi-sectoral Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) was activated at Level 3 – the highest emergency level in Nigeria –led by NCDC in close coordination with the State Public Health EOCs (PHEOC).

- Conducted a strategic meeting with states response coordination teams to strengthen subnational level response
- Deployment of an additional Rapid Response Team (RRT) to Imo State
- Finalised the Local Government Areas (LGA) hotspot strategy document
- Implementation Planning for the training of state teams on surveillance
- Activated new GeneXpert laboratory in Federal Medical Centre (FMC), Owerri
- Ongoing state level IPC training in Katsina State targeting health care workers at primary and secondary heath facilities
- Ongoing supply of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) commodities to Laboratory networks across four states Abia, Bauchi, Kano and Ondo
- Held a coordination meeting with the Nigeria Governors' Forum to strengthen collaboration between states' task force and state social mobilisation committees

- Ongoing review of contact management guidelines
- Received a total of 63 Persons of Interest/returnees from Ghana 18, UK 9, India 36 and they were issued COVID-19 test appointments
- All returnees were received, screened and given NCDC travellers kit at the airport on arrival in Abuja
- Disseminated links for IPC training modules through various networks for health care workers
- Deployment of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) commodities to the sample collection centres in FCT
- Ongoing processing of Personal protective Equipment (PPE) requests from states and treatment centres
